The Approach

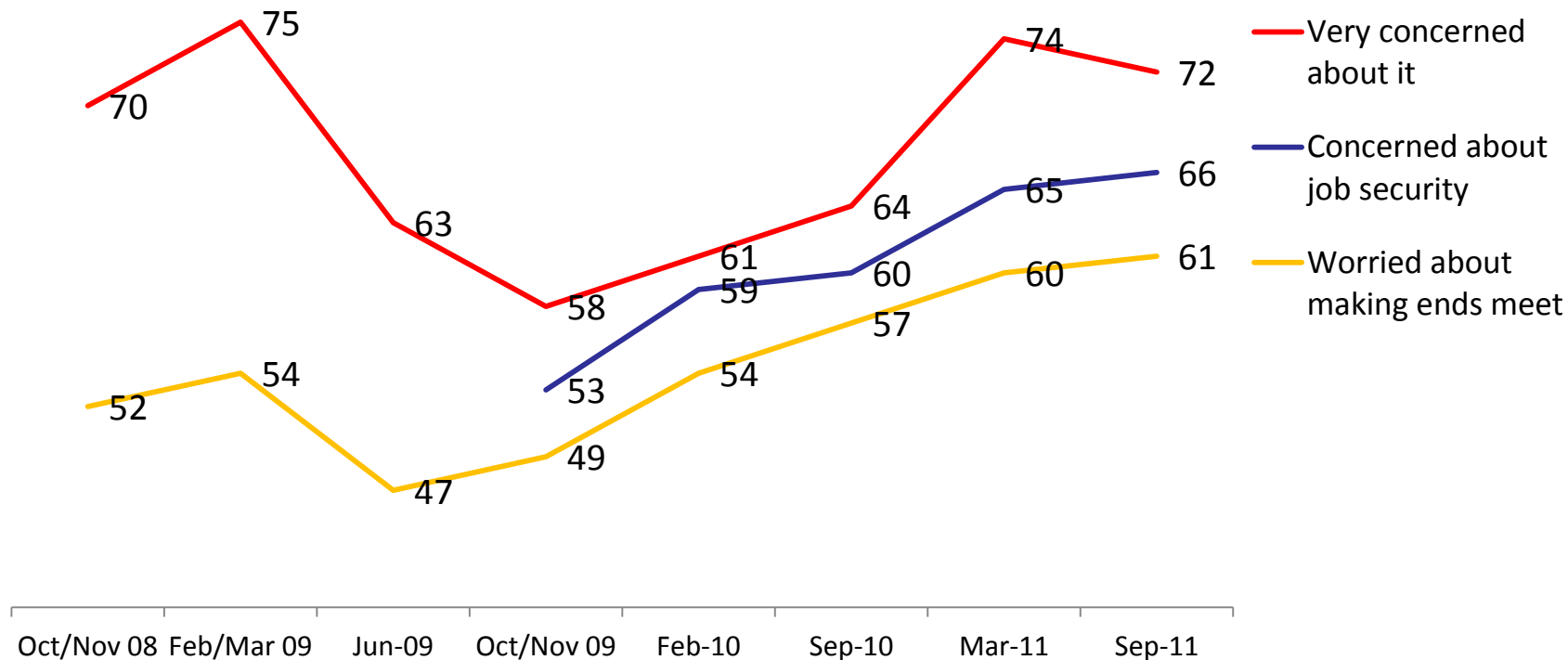
- **1000+ quantitative online interviews**
 - **15 – 20 September 2011**
 - **20 minute questionnaire**
 - **GB population (18yrs +)**
- **Included key questions on impact of & attitudes towards economic downturn tracked quarterly since Oct 08**

THE IN-GOING CLIMATE

*Ongoing impact of, & attitudes to the
Economic Downturn*

High levels of concern over economy & its impact largely unchanged over 2011

% 'Strongly agree'/'Slightly agree' with each statement

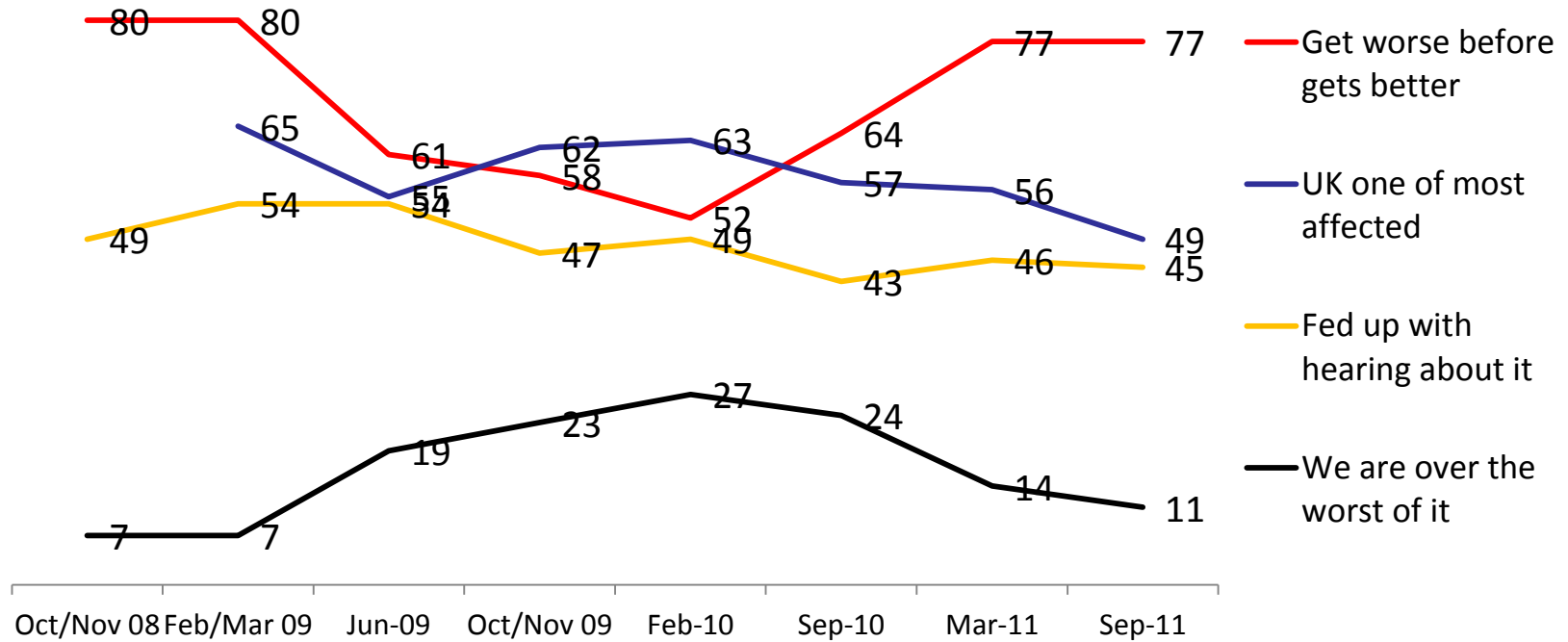

- though fewer now feel the UK is one of the worst affected countries

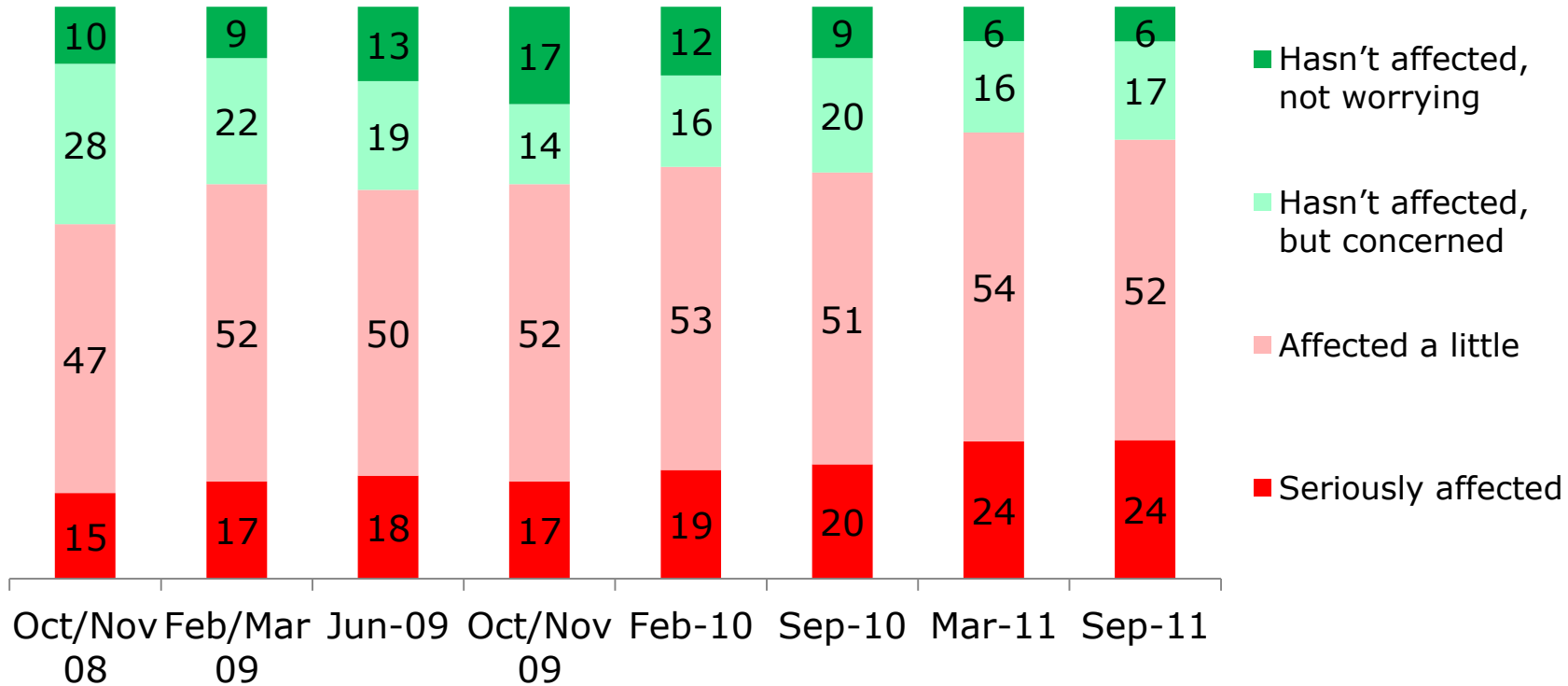

Impact of economic downturn (%)

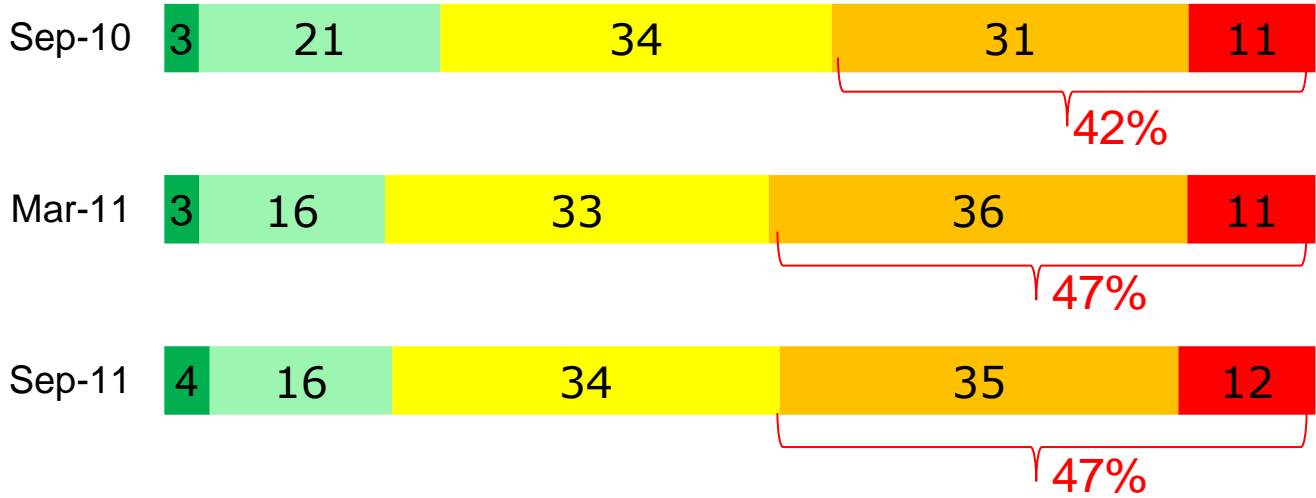


Q2. Which of the following best describes your feelings about the economic downturn or credit crunch?

■ Much better ■ A little better ■ No better or worse ■ A little worse ■ Much worse

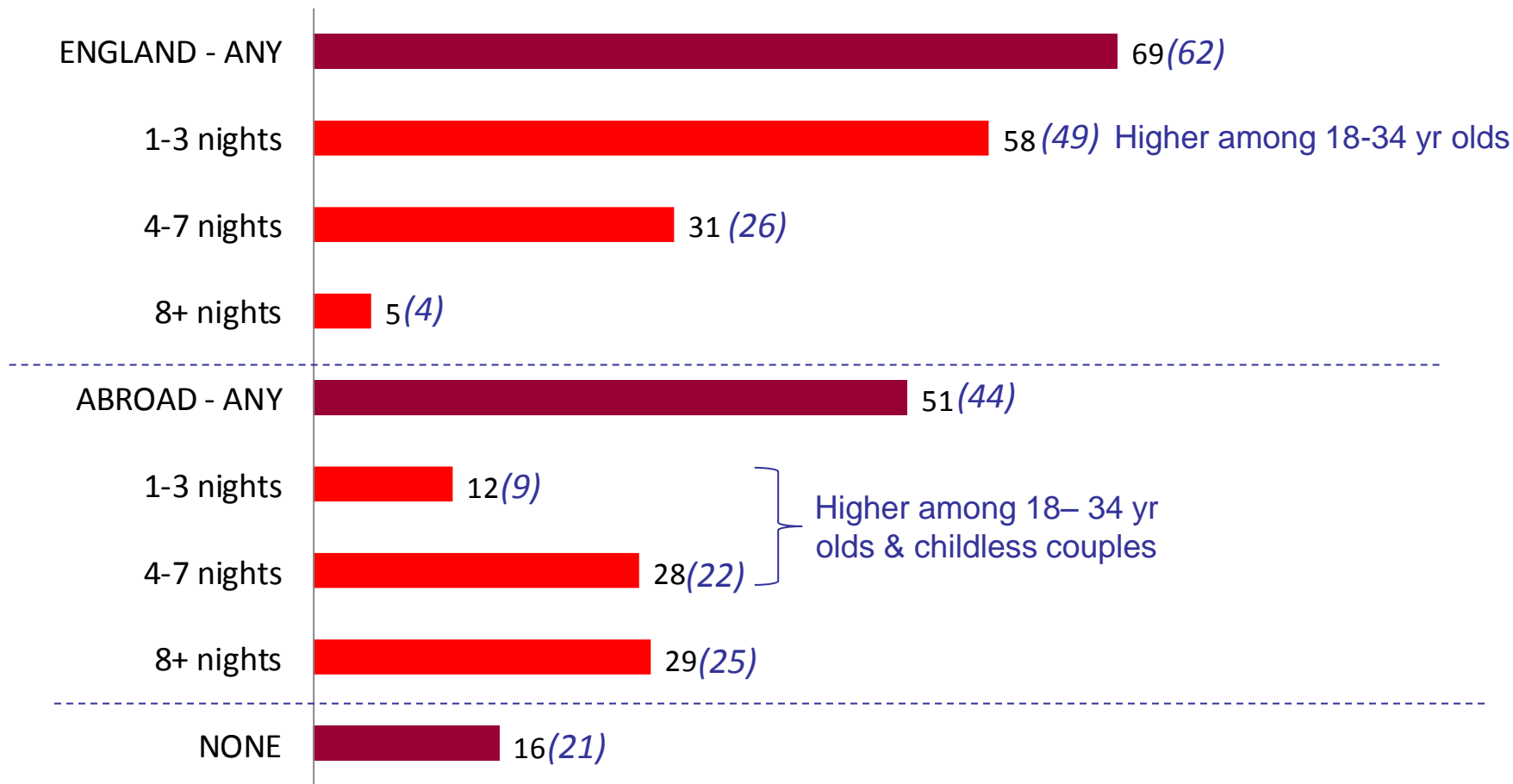

THE 2011 HOLIDAY

7 in 10 holidayed in England in 2011; only longer holidays more likely to be abroad

% took holiday type in 2011 (figs in brackets show % already taken this year)

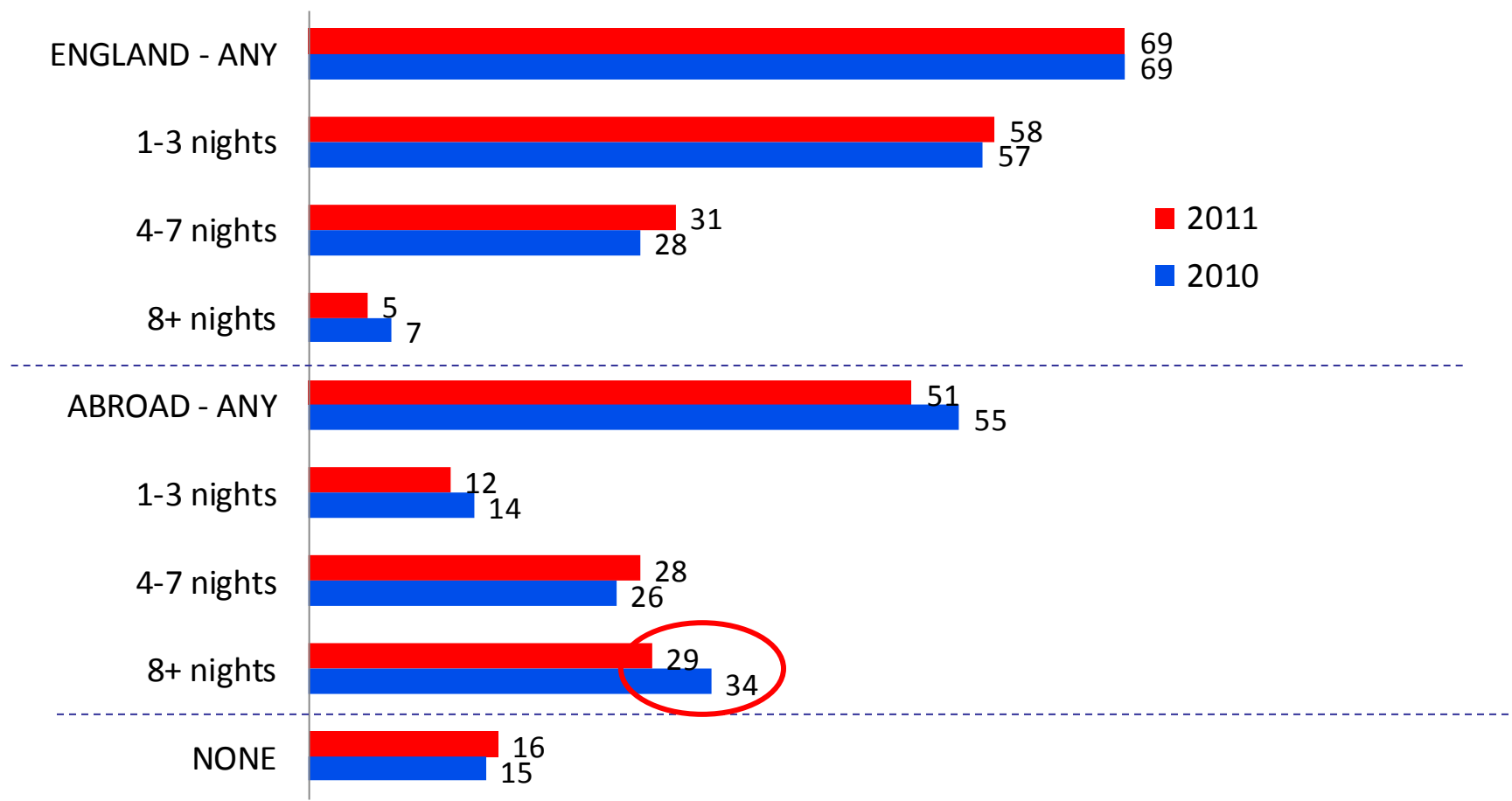


Q7/9d How many of each of these holidays have you taken so far in 2011/will you take before the end of 2011? Base: All 1000+

Slightly fewer took holidays abroad in 2011 vs 2010 – especially 8+ night trips

-slight increase in 4-7 night England breaks

'Switchers' and 'Extras' – A Reminder

- 'Switchers' took at least one holiday in England that directly replaced a holiday they would have taken abroad
- 'Extras' took more domestic holidays than they had done previously
- Together, these groups ('Staycationers') drove the uplift in domestic holidays in 2009 and 2010

3 in 10 were 'Staycationers' in 2011 – more both 'switching' and taking extra holidays

% Staycationer Types 2009 - 2011

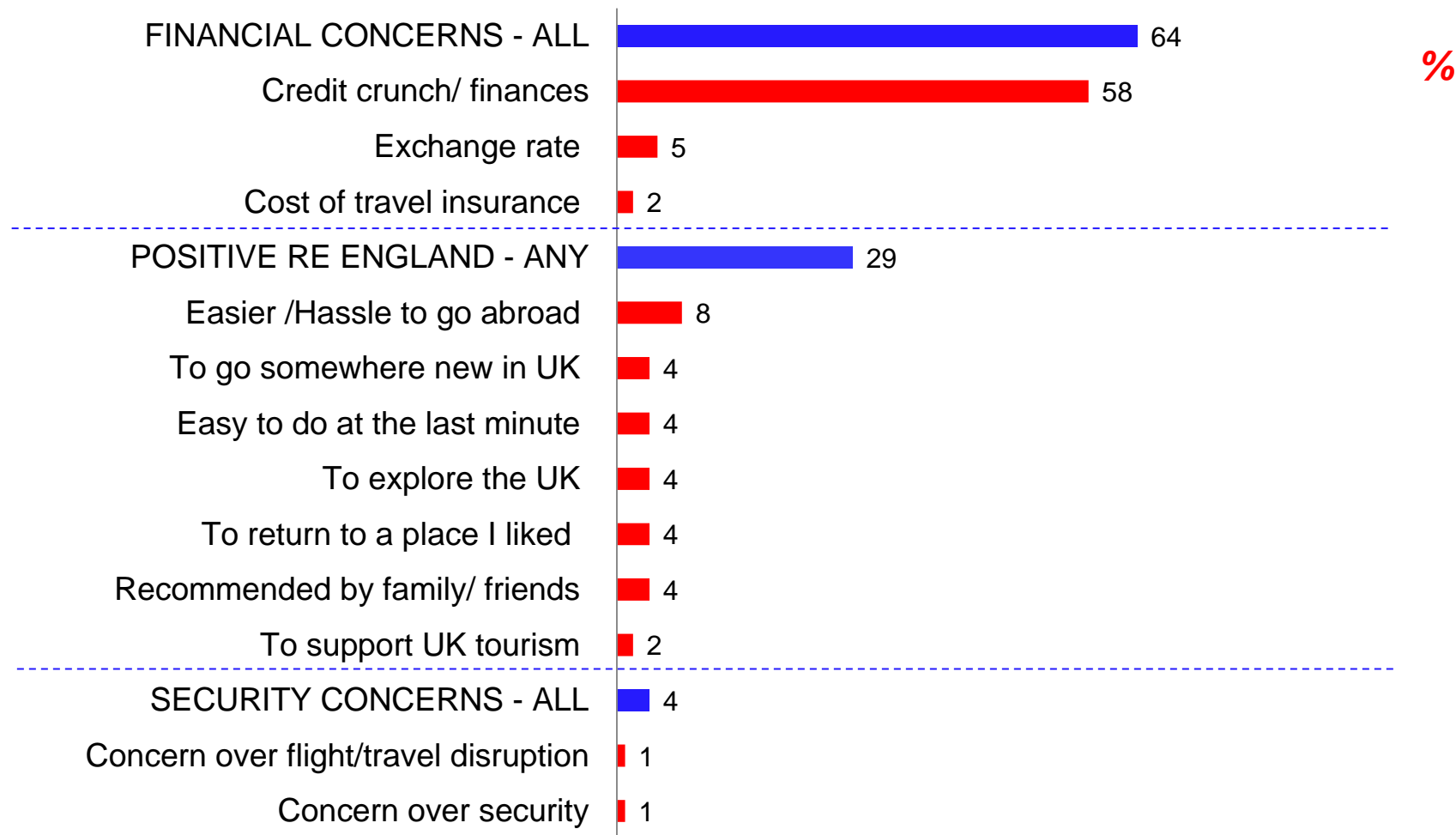


Switcher profile now has a slightly higher proportion of men, ABs and couples than in 2009

The **MAIN** reason for 'switching' is financial, though 3 in 10 do so for positive reasons

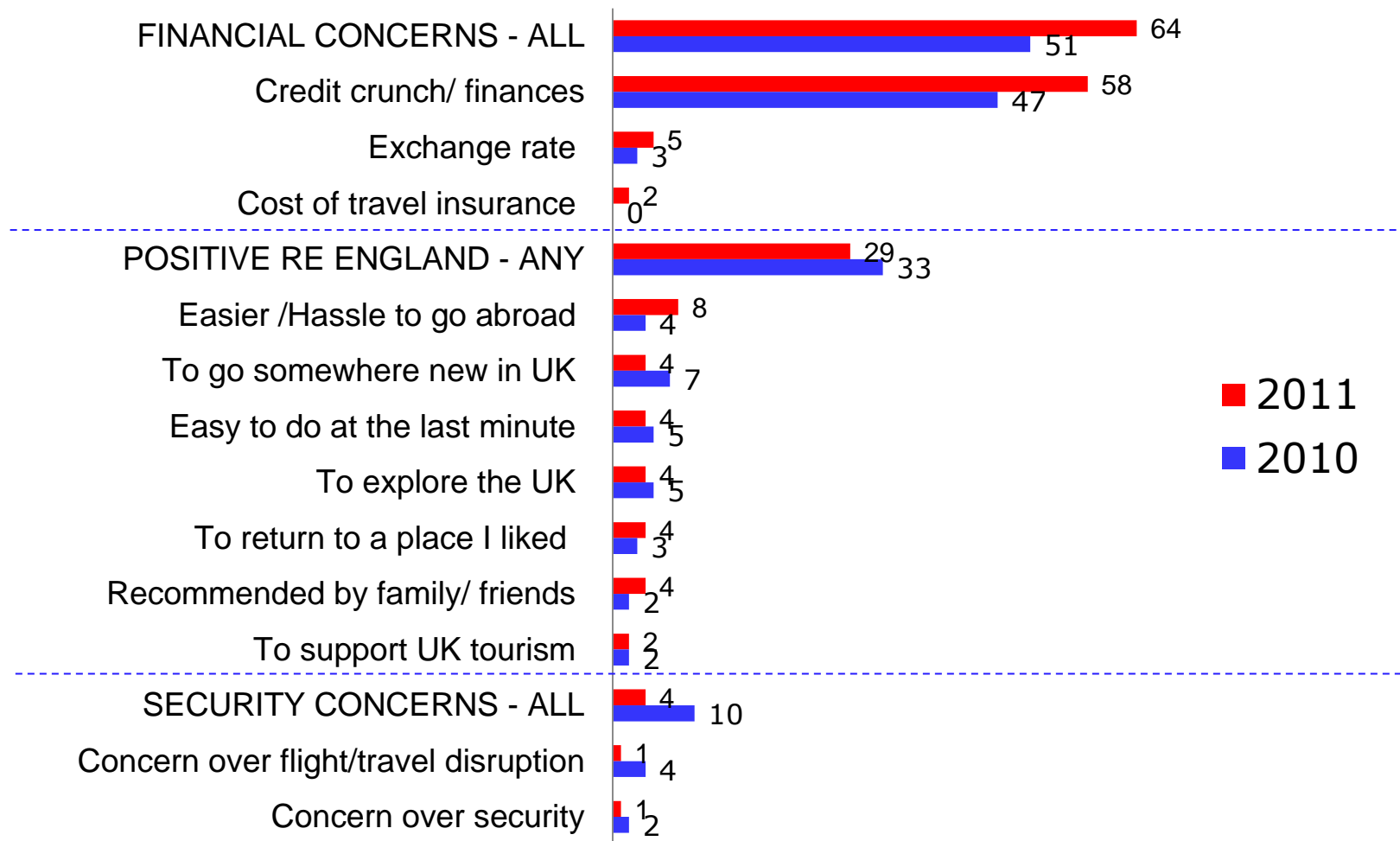
MAIN REASON for replacing a 2011 hol normally taken abroad with one in England

The importance of financial constraints for 'switching' has increased since 2010

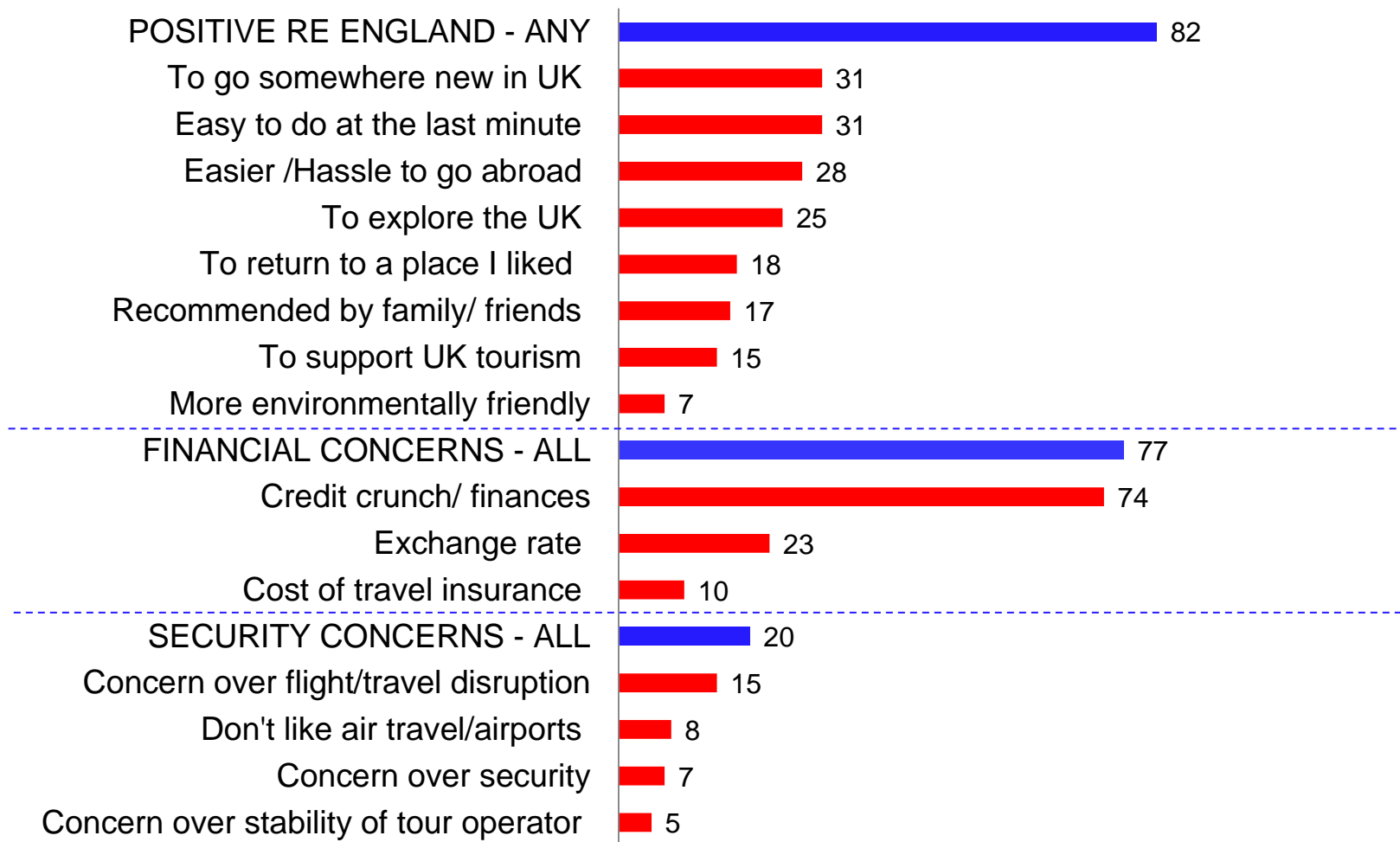
MAIN REASON for replacing a holiday normally taken abroad with one in England

Positive aspects of England are very strong additional reasons for 'switching'

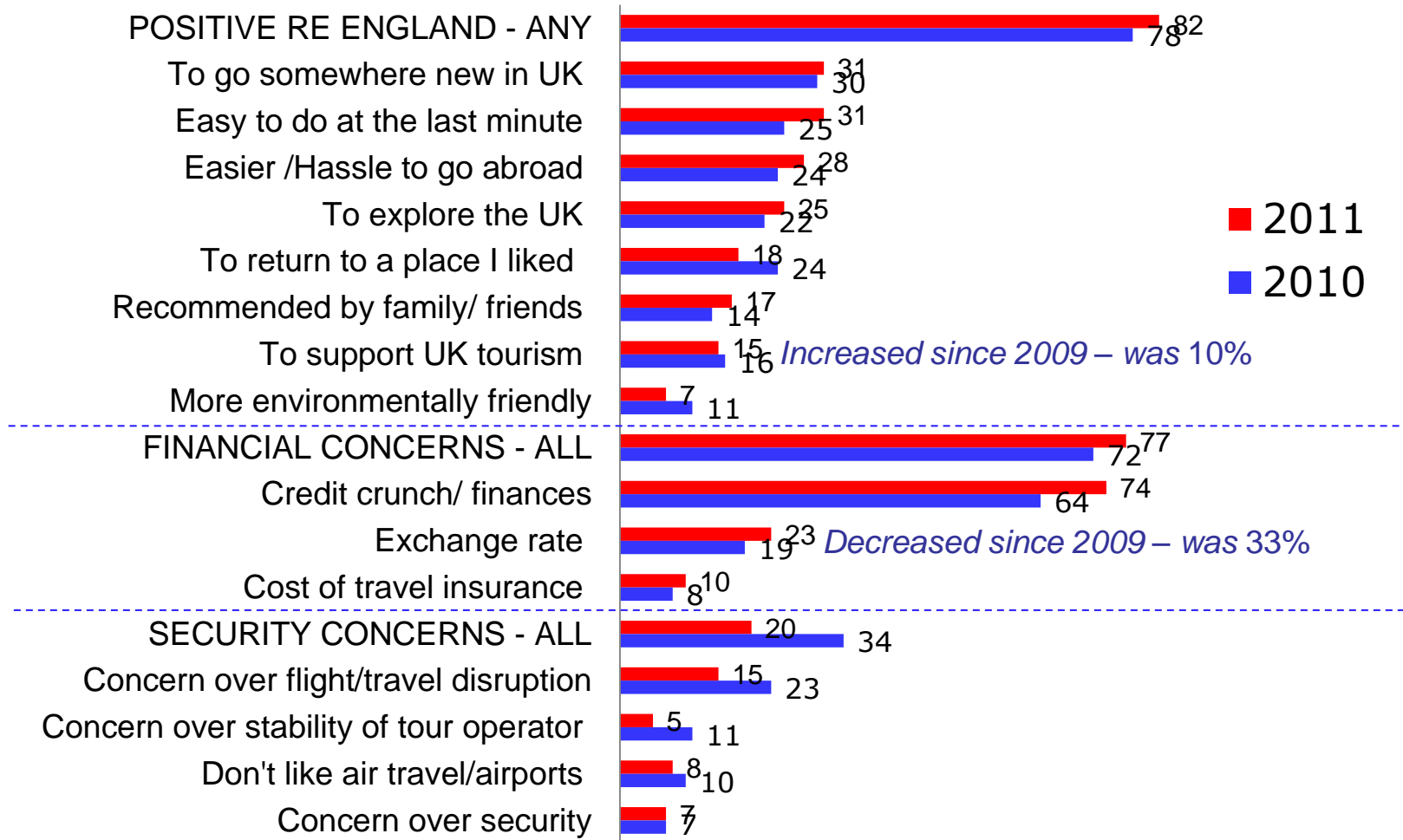
ALL REASONS for replacing a holiday normally taken abroad with one in England

Importance of economy for 'switching' increased since 2010, security concern lower

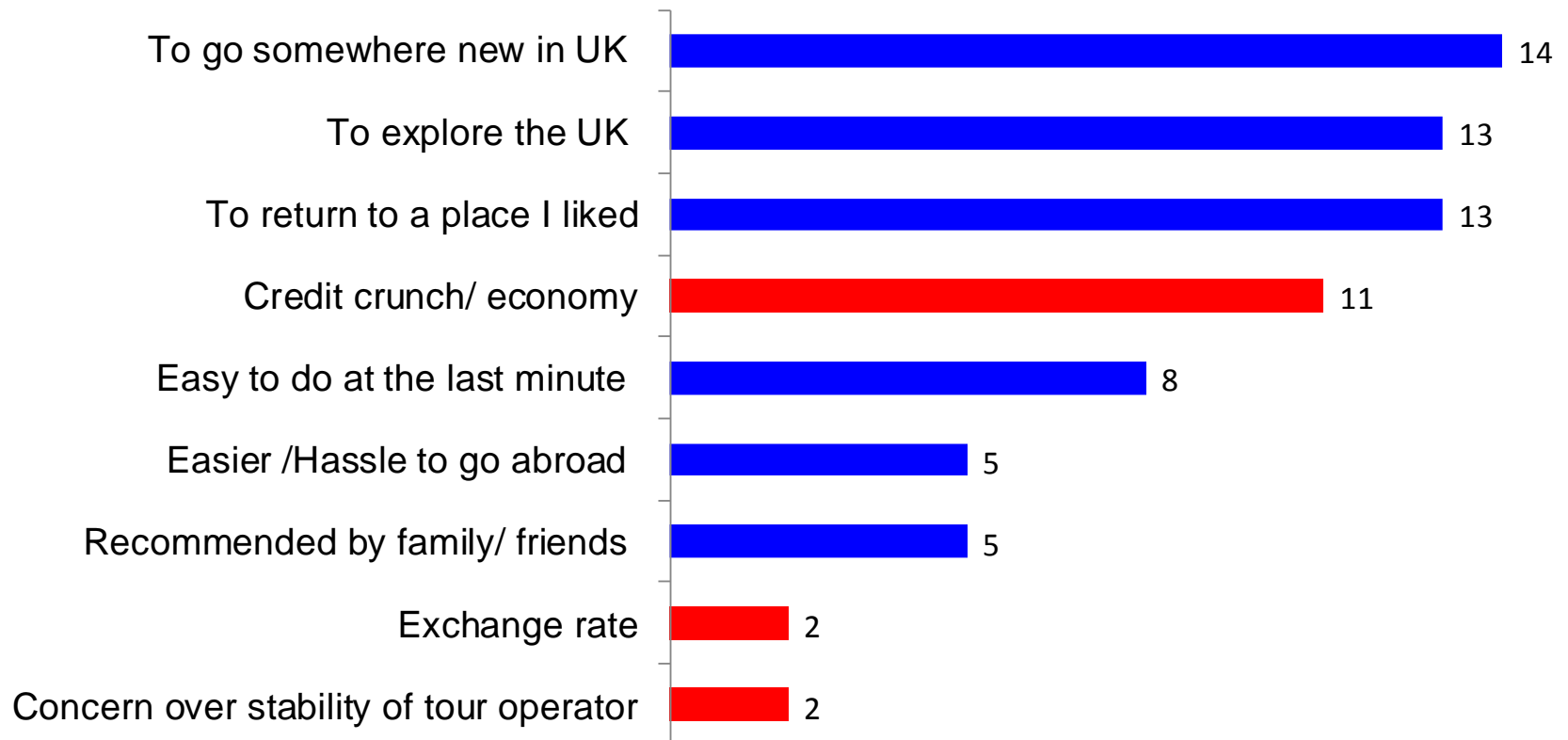
ALL REASONS for replacing a holiday normally taken abroad with one in England

Extra UK holiday taken for positive reasons more than financial or security concerns

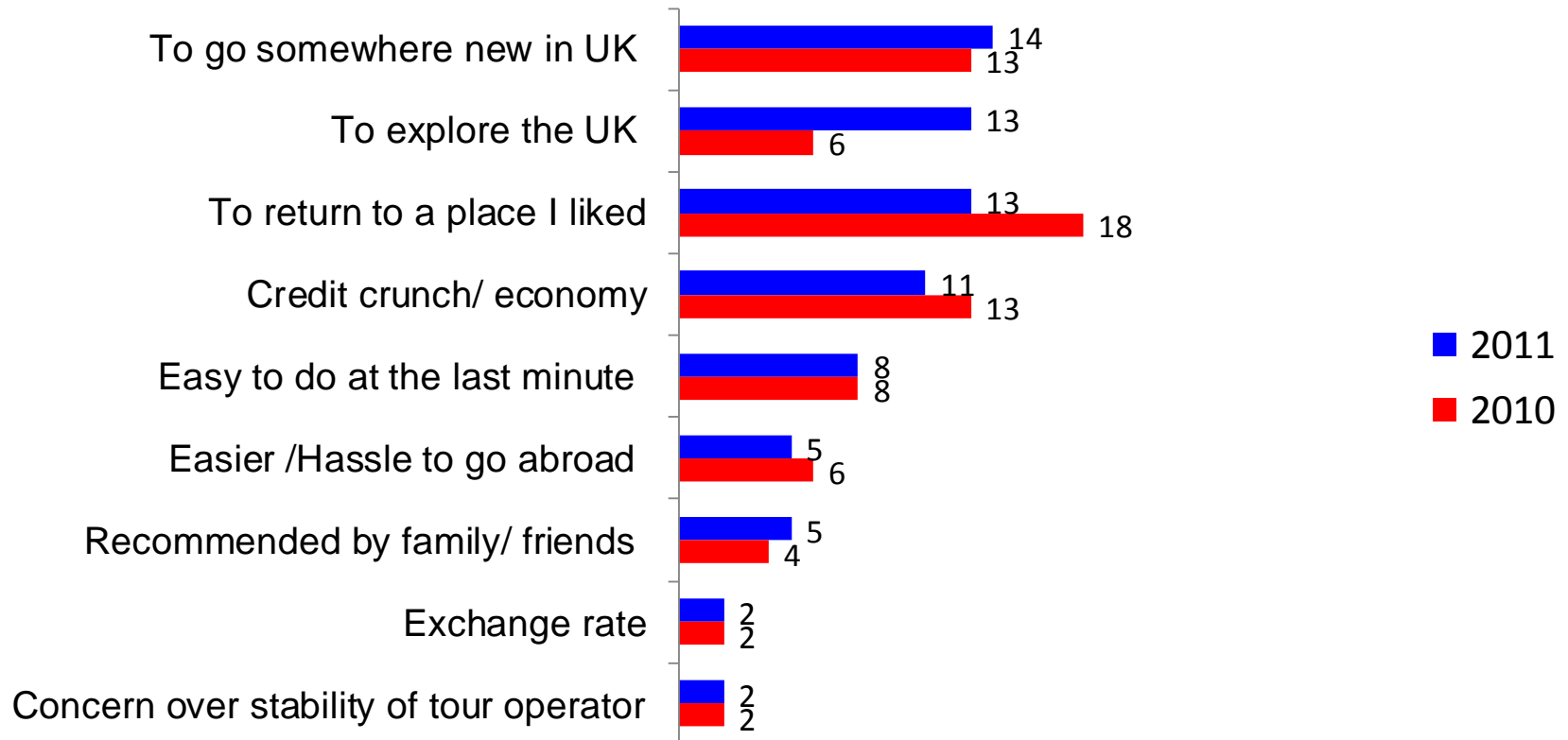
MAIN REASON for taking MORE holiday in UK in 2011

Exploring somewhere new increased in importance for taking extra holiday

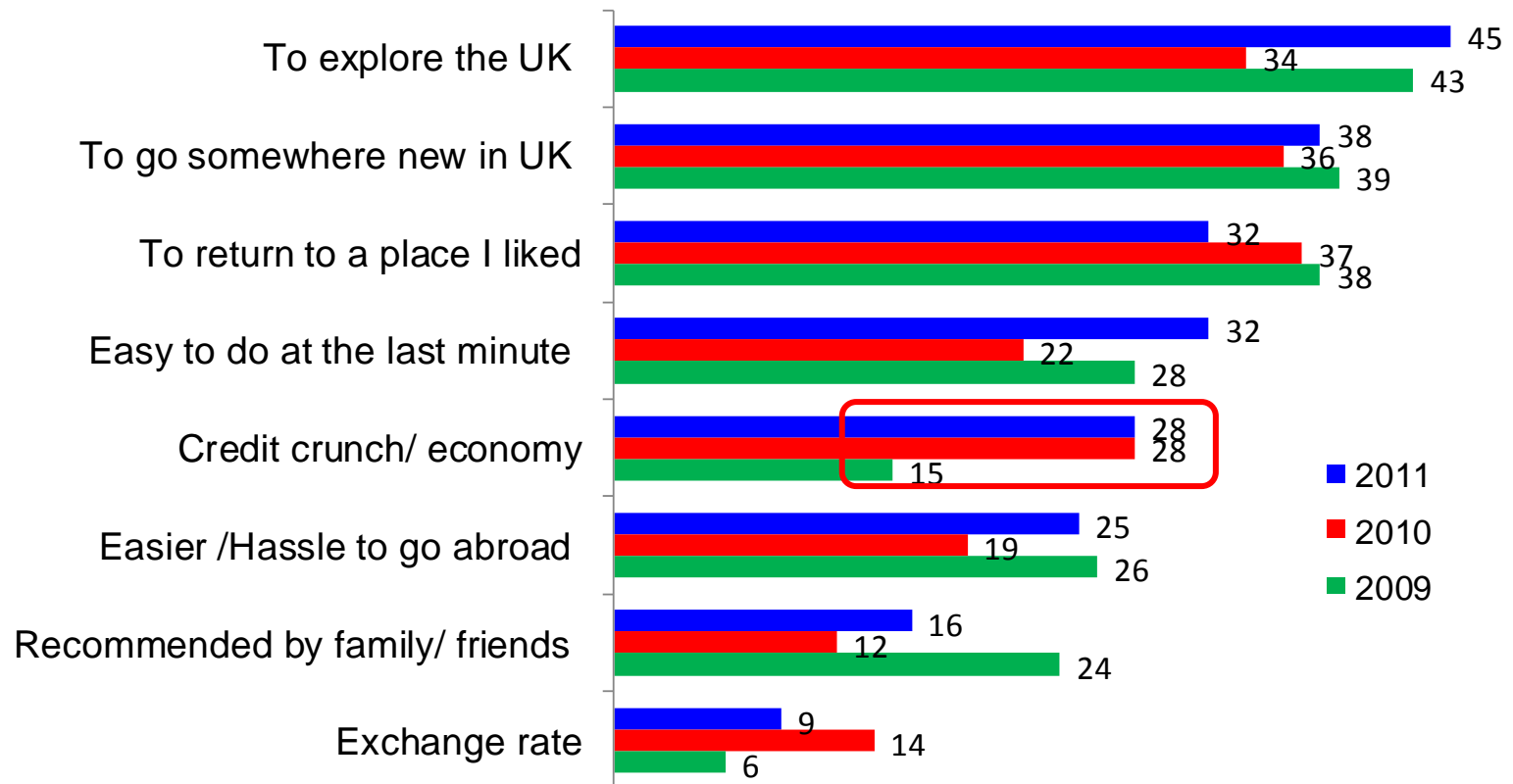
MAIN REASON for taking **MORE** holiday in UK

(among those not replacing a holiday normally taken abroad)



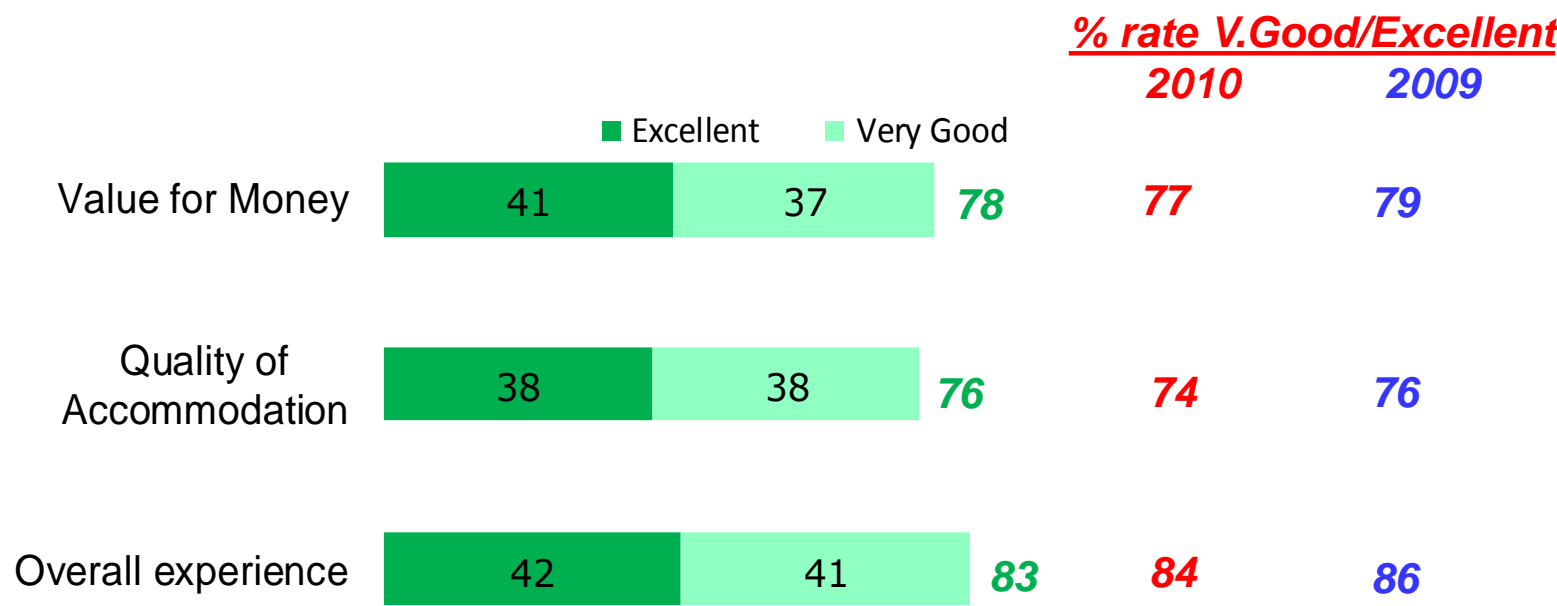

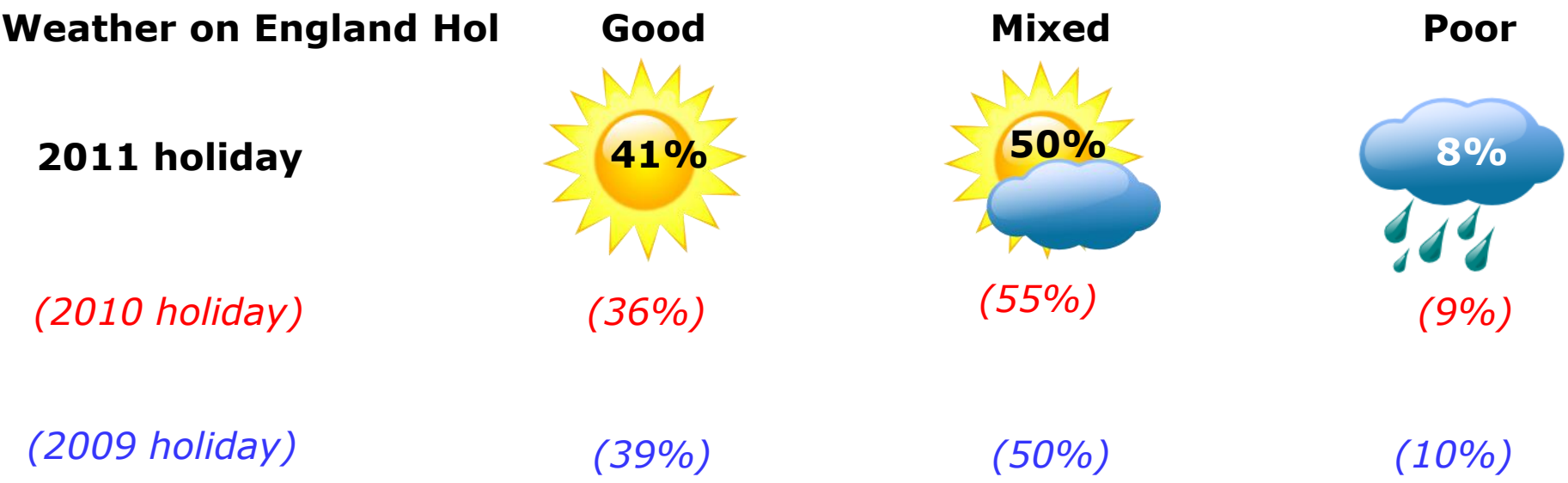
England holidays continue to deliver a great experience

Weather perceptions slightly better overall in 2011 to date vs 2010



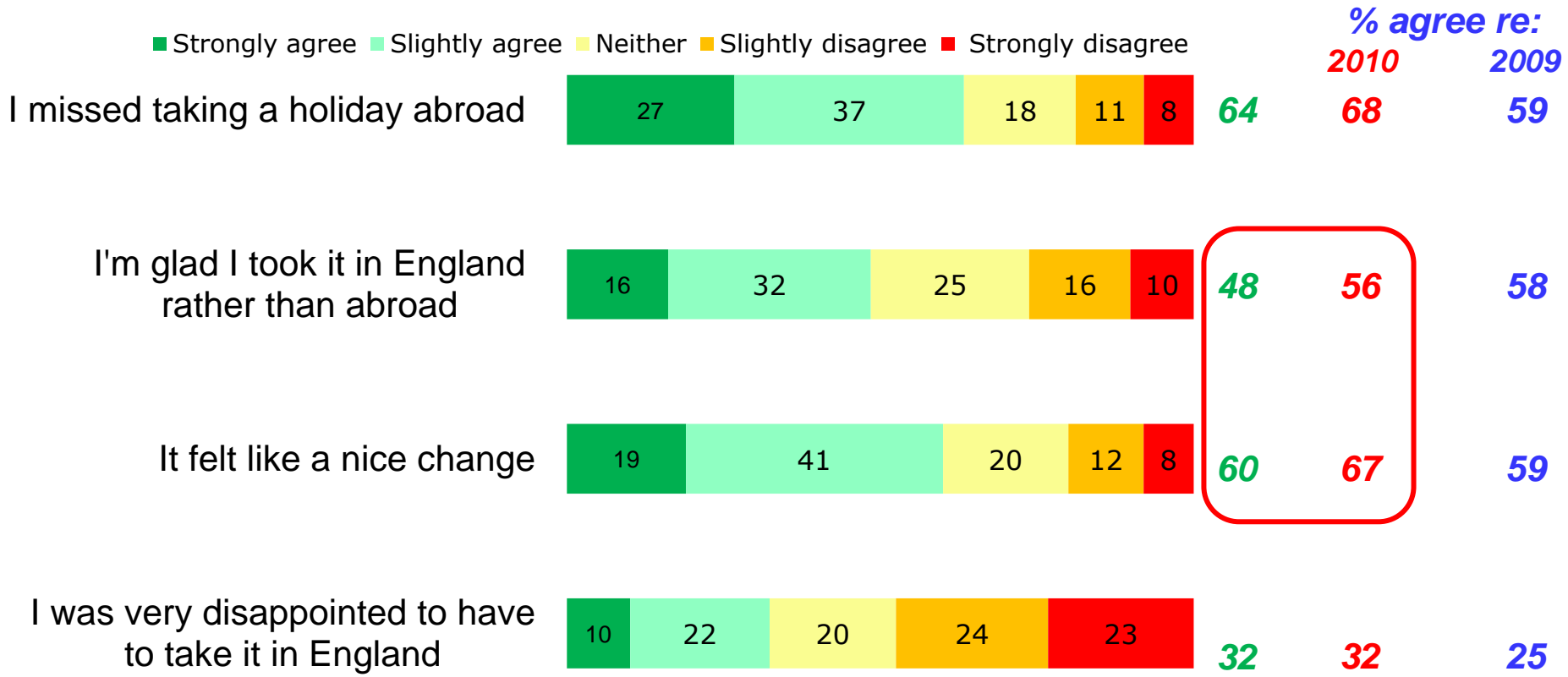
- As may be expected, the weather affects the overall rating of the holiday

Attitudes to taking a holiday in England rather than abroad in 2010 (%)

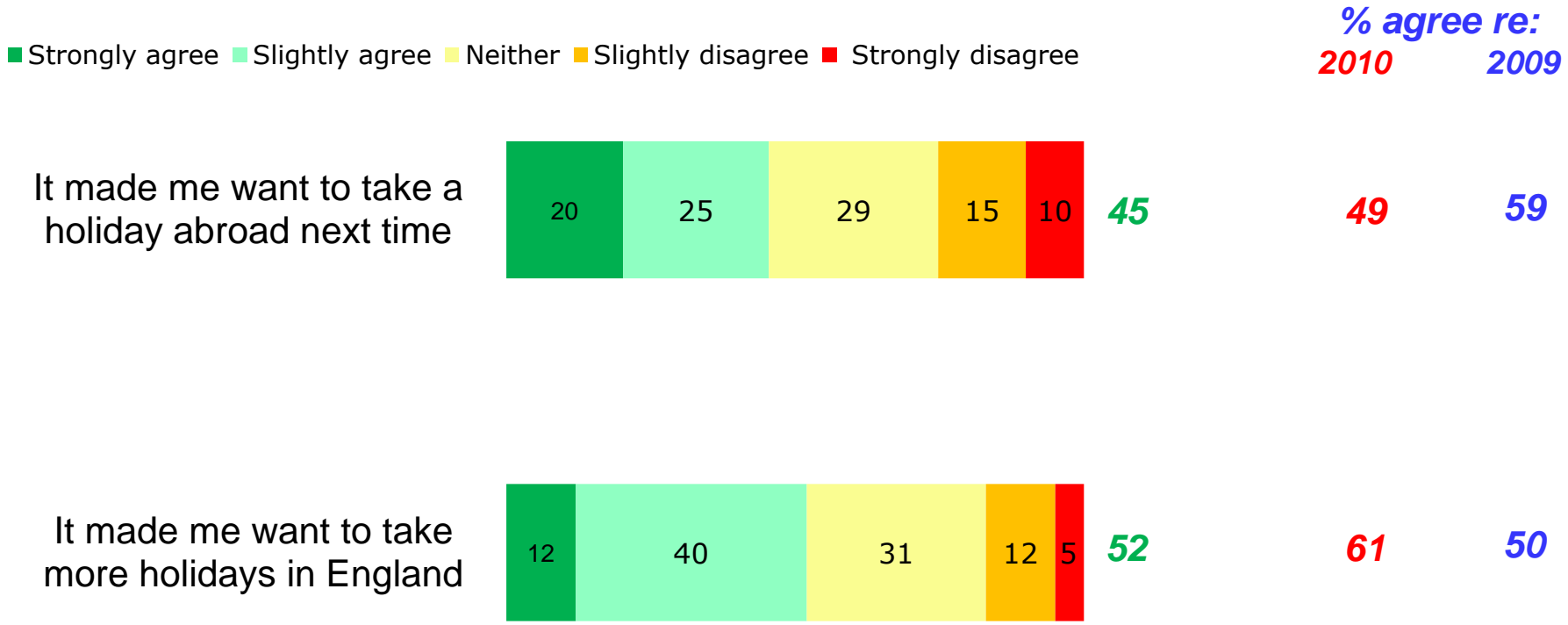

- Though almost half are motivated to want a holiday abroad next time

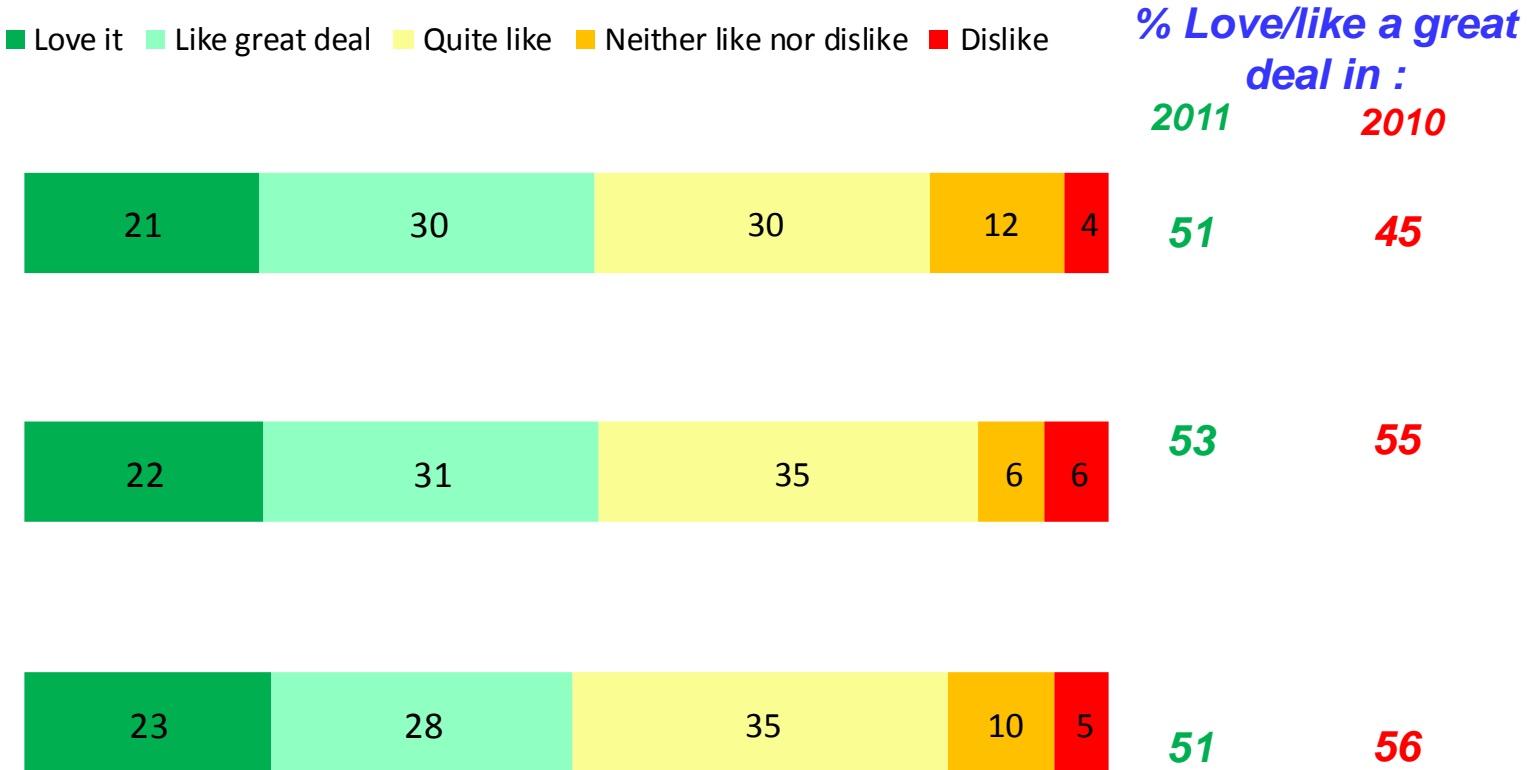
Attitudes to taking a holiday in England rather than abroad in 2011 (%)

Views towards English holidays are very positive and very few dislike the idea

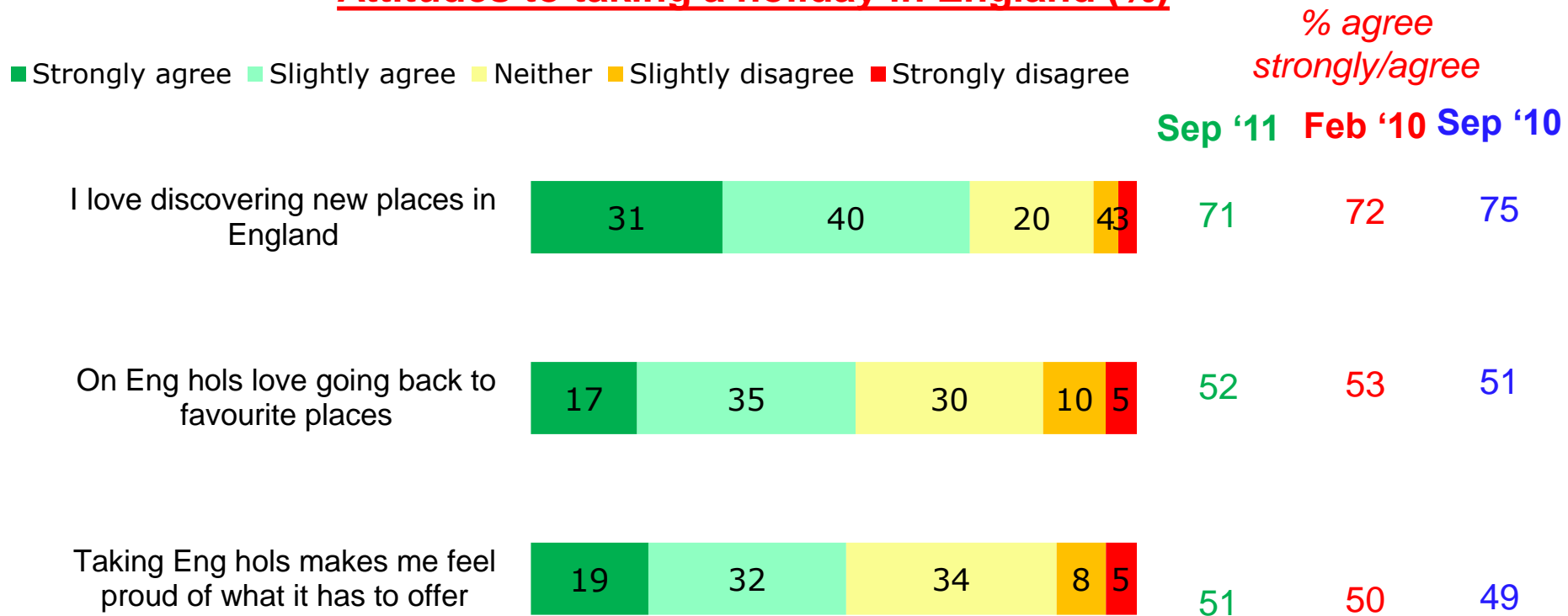
Overall extent of liking holidaying in England (%)

Discovering *new* places in England remains key. Half feel pride via English holidays

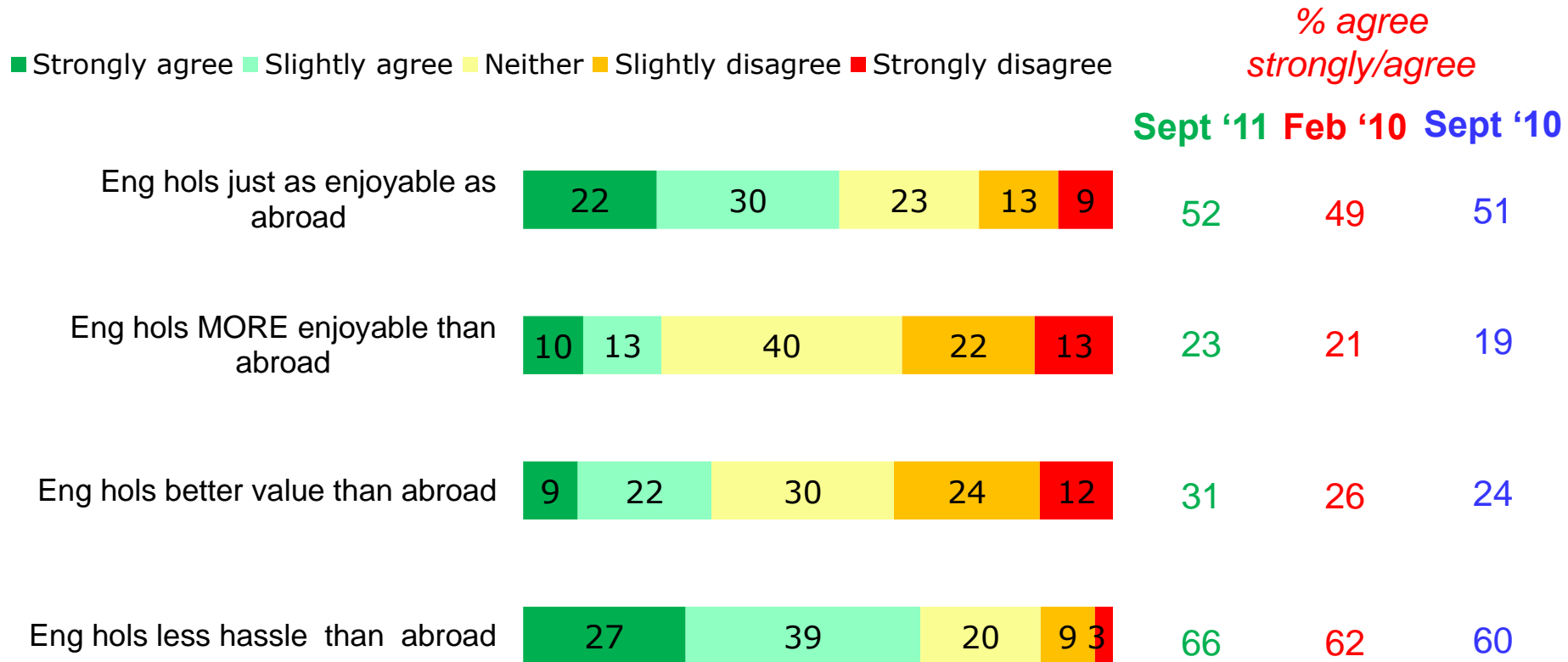
Attitudes to taking a holiday in England (%)

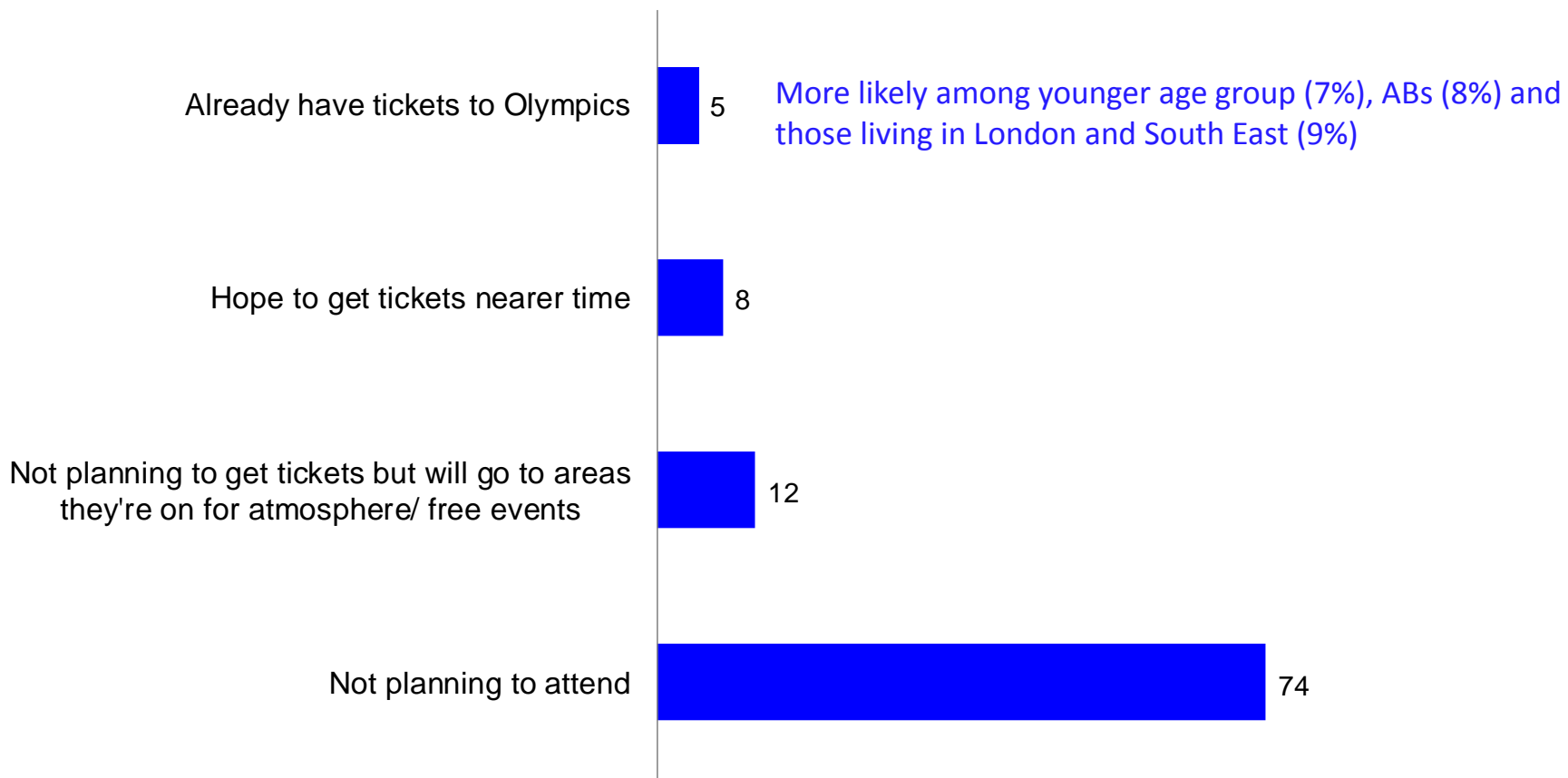

THE LONDON 2012 OLYMPIC GAMES

Almost 2 in 10 do not have Olympic tickets but hope to visit the Games

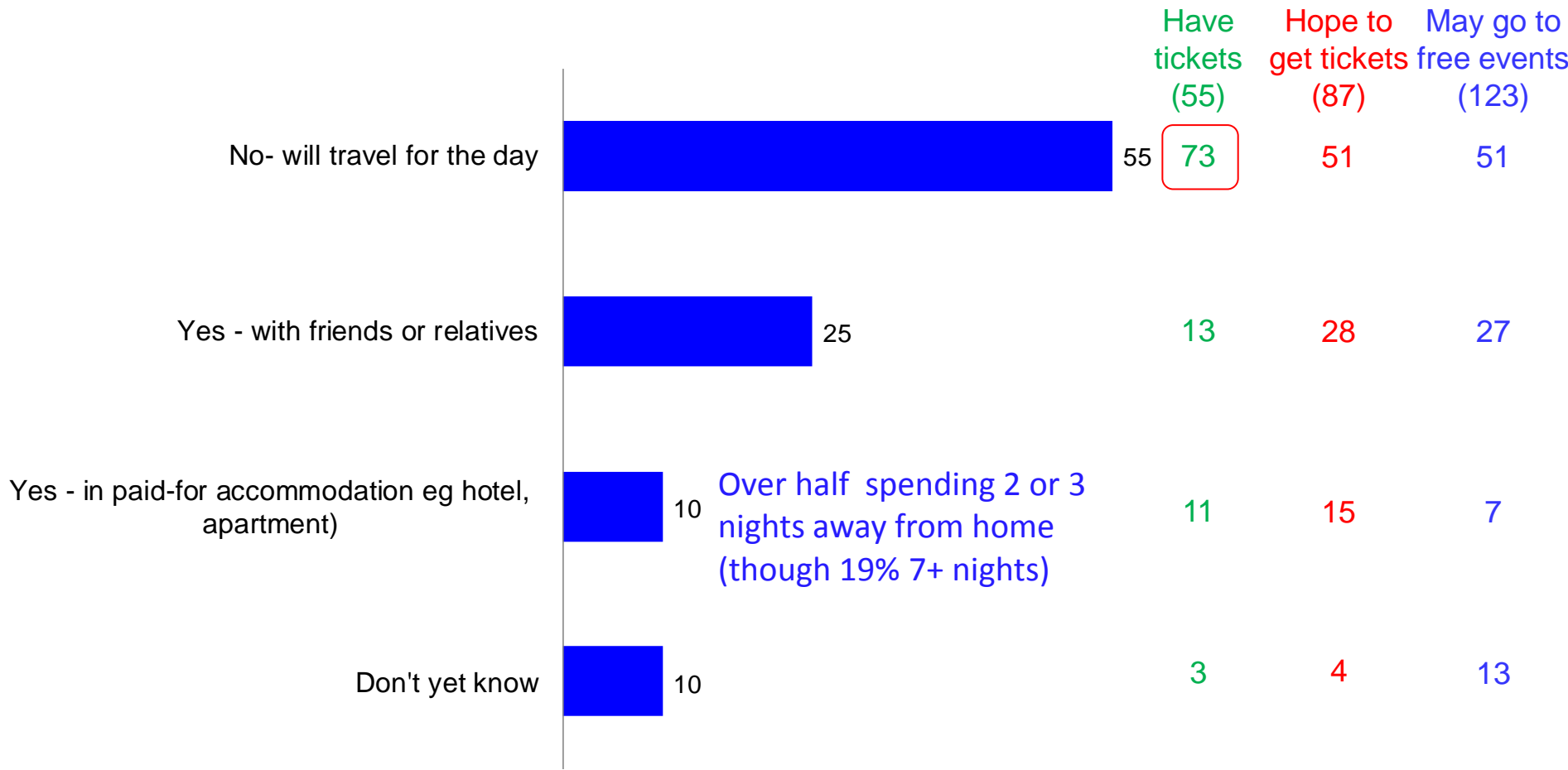
Status re London 2012 Olympic Games (%)

Just 1 in 10 going to the Games expect to stay in hotels etc, typically for 2 or 3 nights

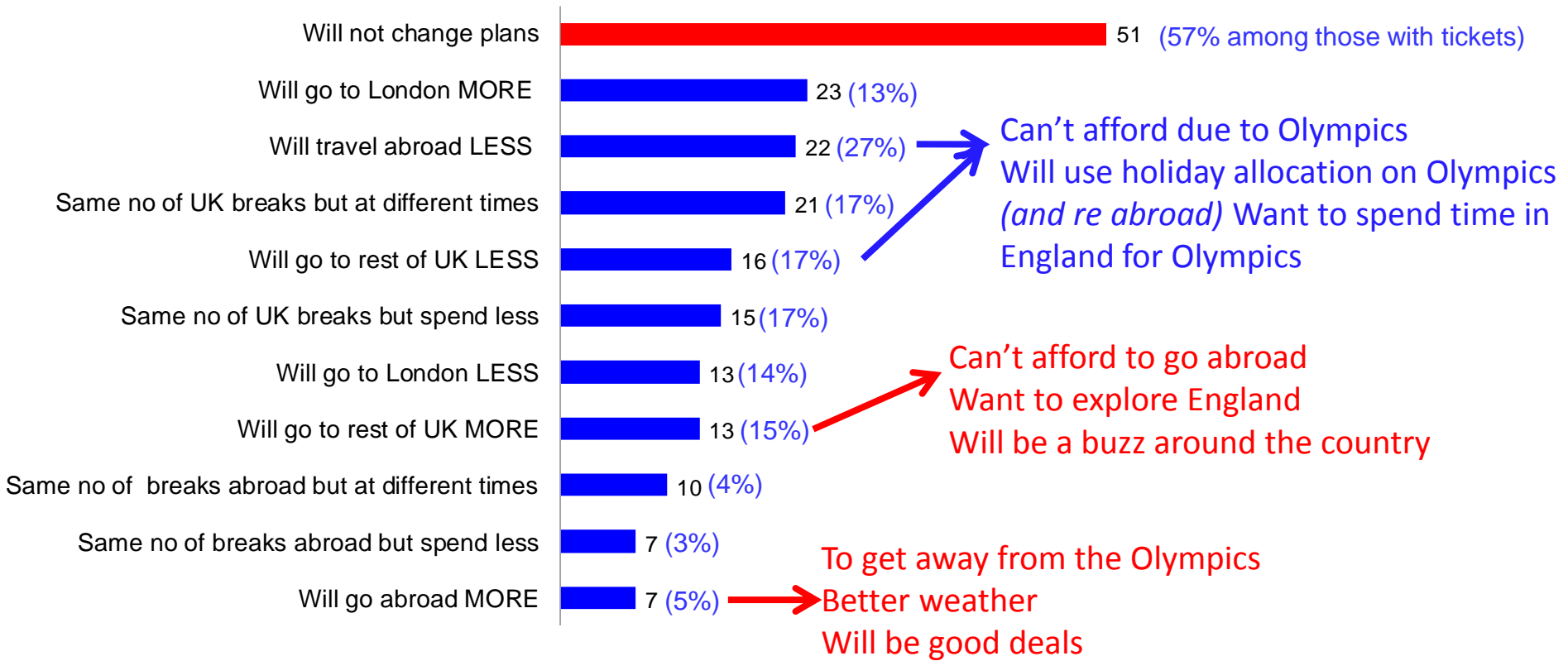
Whether visitors to the Games (or areas they're in) will stay away from home (%)

Half of those planning to go to the Games will change their '12 holiday plans as a result

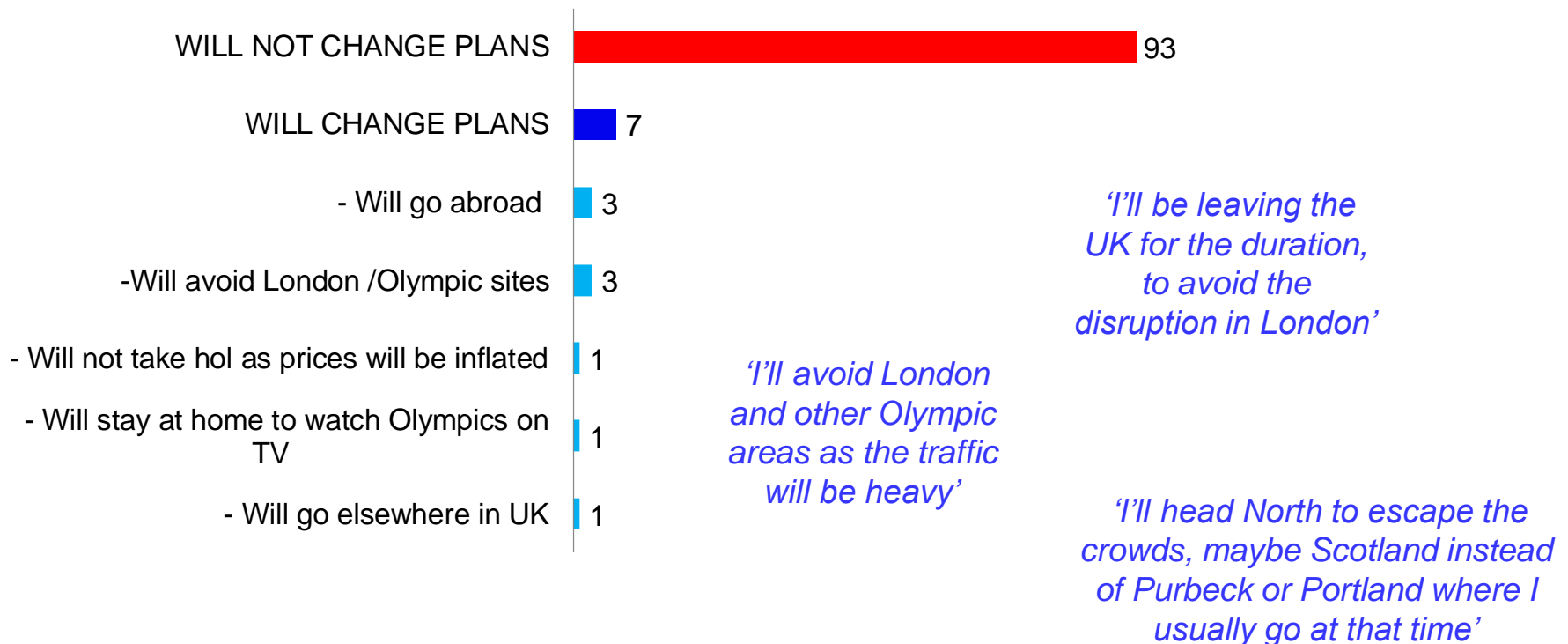
How, if at all, will visiting the Games change 2012 holiday plans (% - can mention all that apply)

2012 holiday plans largely unchanged among those NOT planning to go to the Games

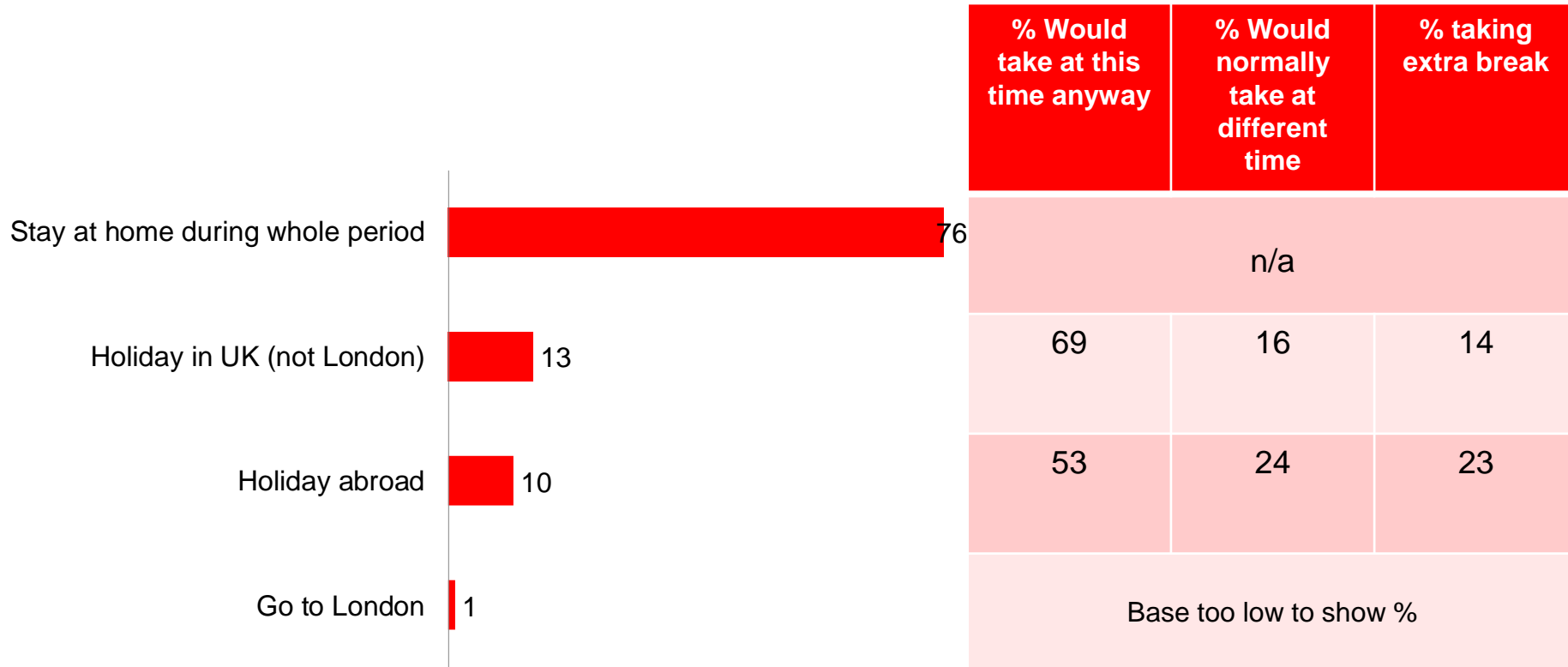
How the London Games will change 2012 holiday plans for those NOT visiting the Games (%)

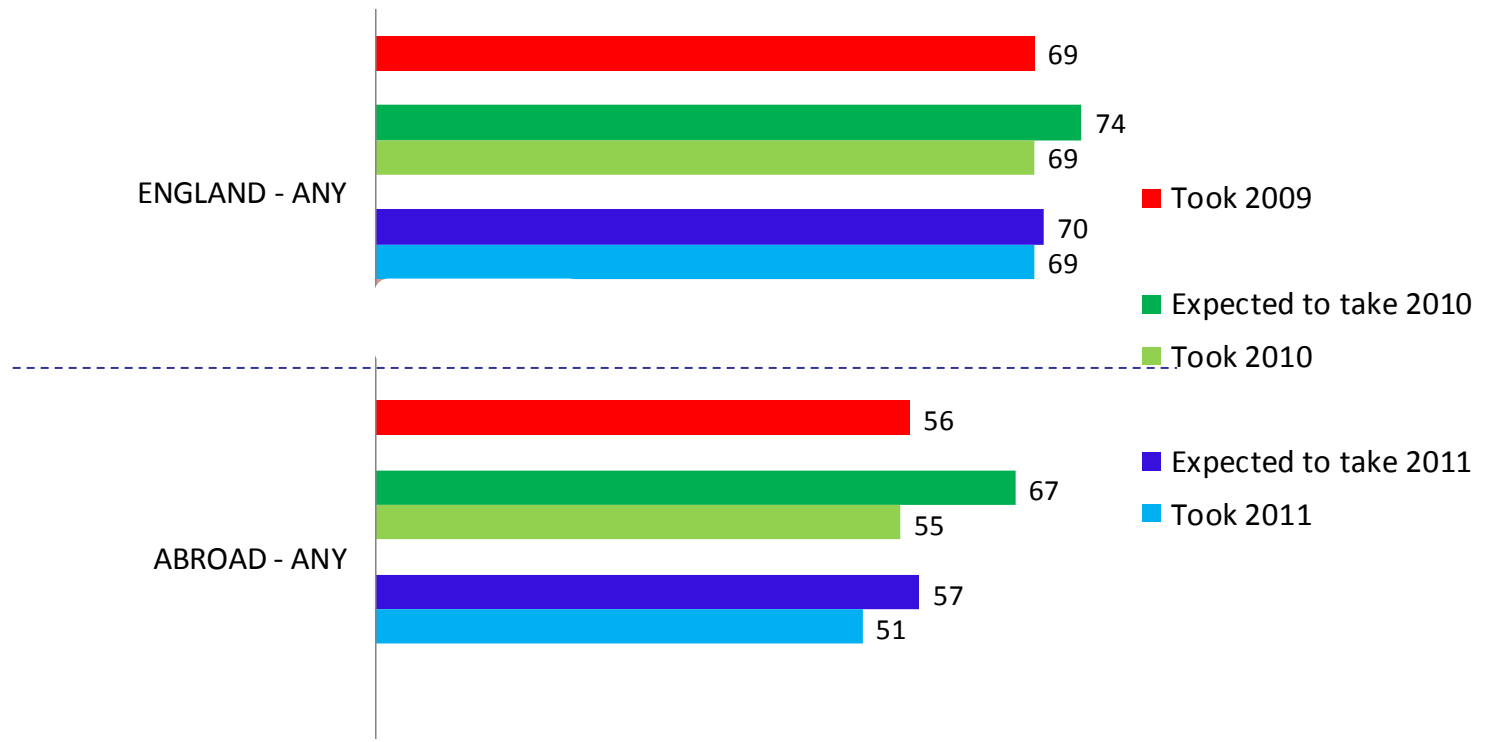
2012 AND BEYOND

- *What holidays are people expecting (hoping?) to take in 2012?*
- *Hopes for holidays in a stable economic climate*

Holiday plans – particularly those abroad - have tended to be optimistic vs reality

- though less over-optimism re 2011 than re 2010

2011 holidays: expectations vs reality (% expecting to take/ having taken)

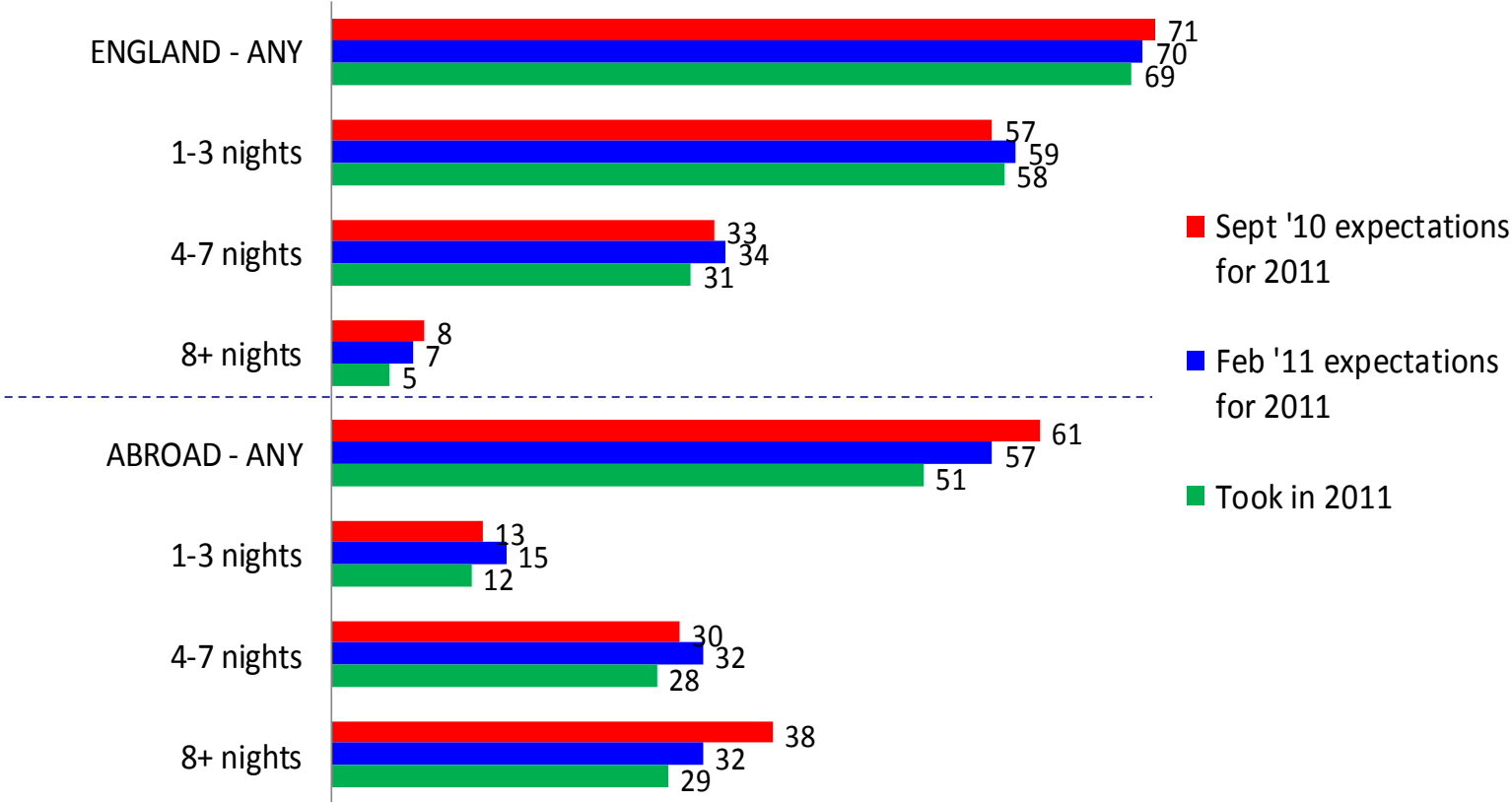

Most optimism has been around the longer holidays abroad

2011 holidays: expectations vs reality (% expecting to take/ having taken)



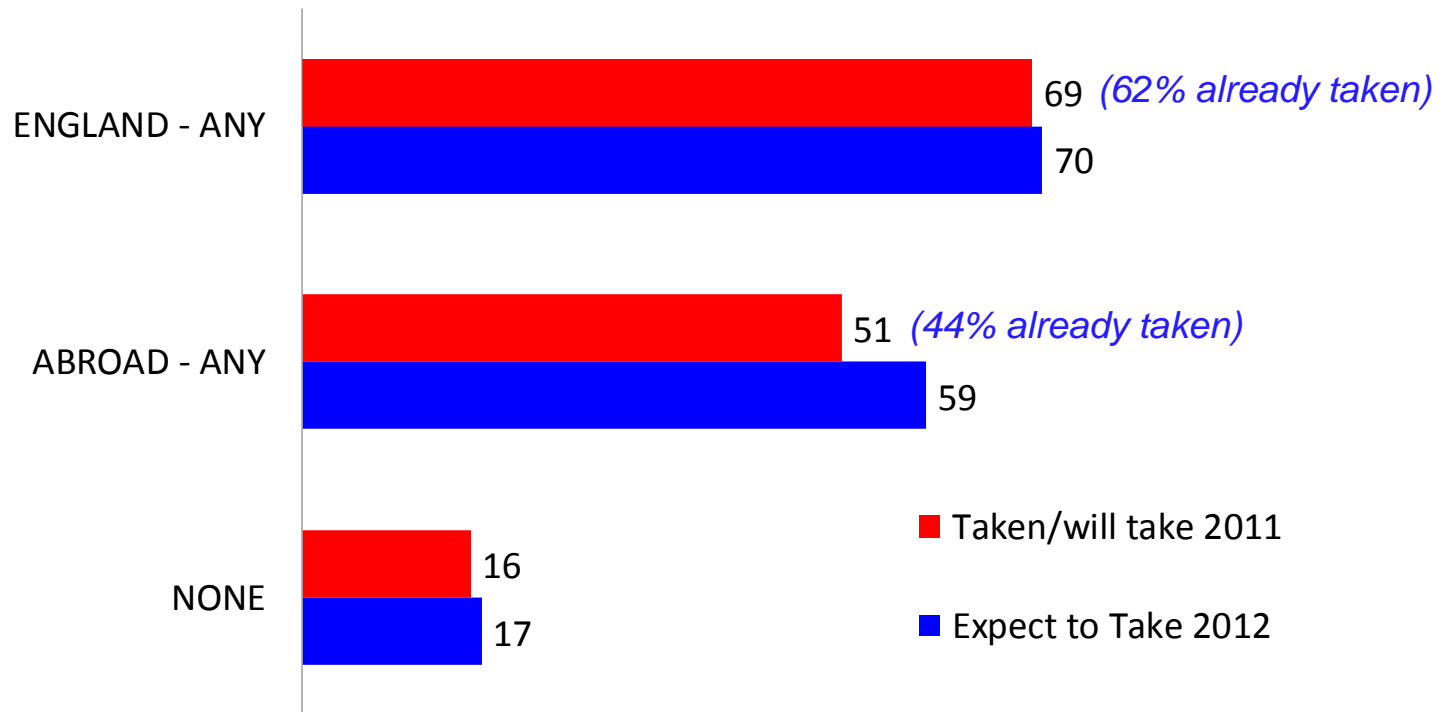

Expected increase in taking a holiday abroad next year, not at expense of England hols

- this anticipated increase abroad next year may also prove optimistic, whilst plans re England have tended to be more realistic

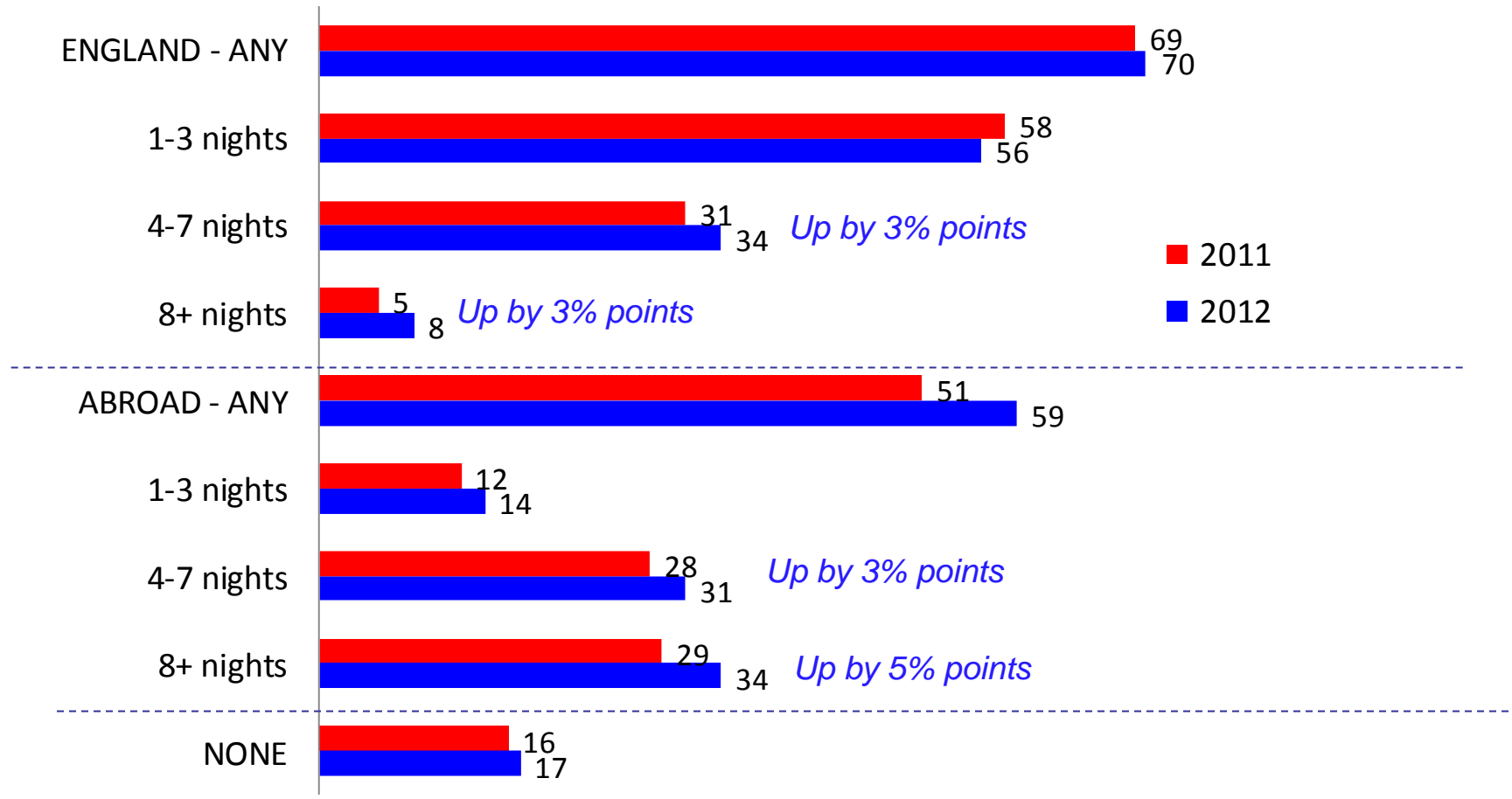
% taken/will take in 2011 / expecting to take holiday type in 2012

Anticipated increase in numbers taking mid/long breaks abroad and at home in 2012

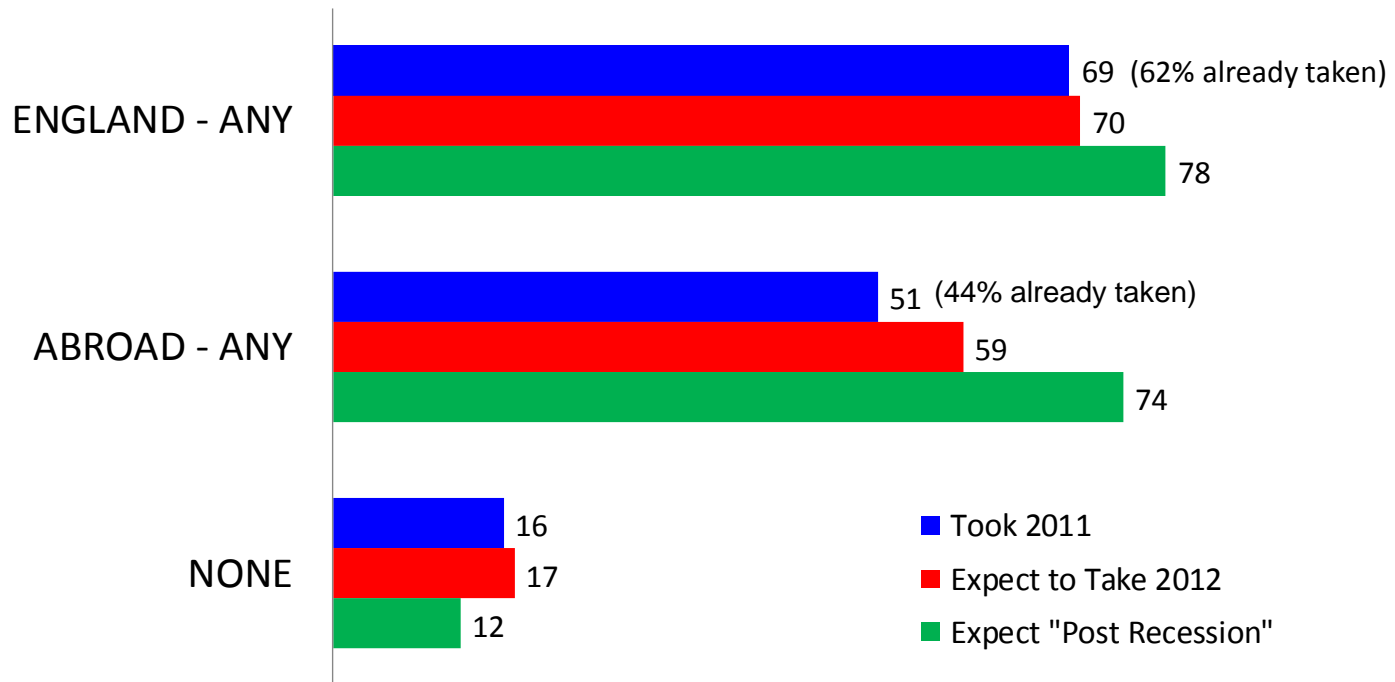
% took holiday type in 2011/ expect to take in 2012

% took hol 2011/ will take 2012 / expect to take "post recession"

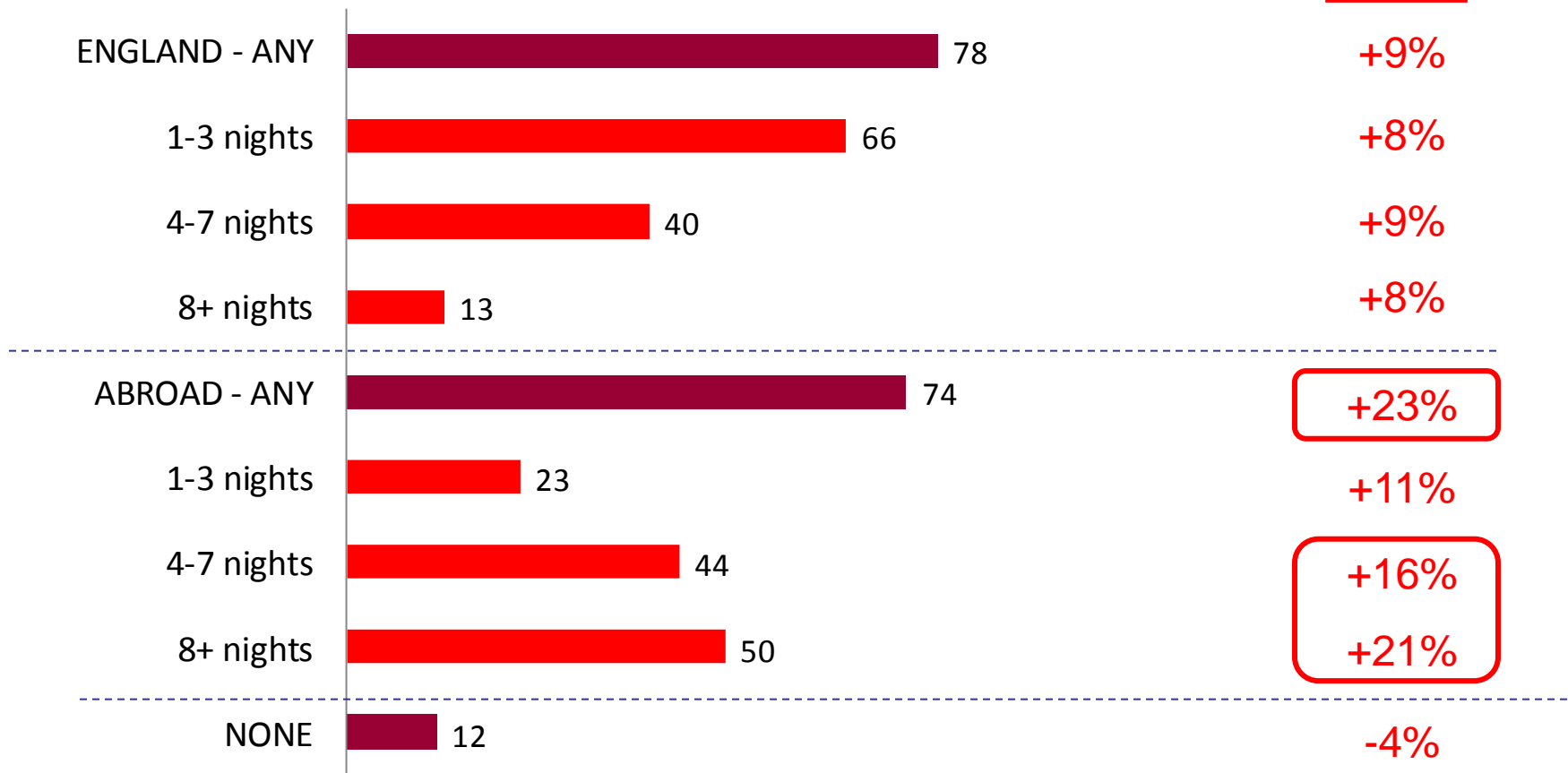

'Post recession', greater expectation of longer foreign breaks – with mid-length as the real battleground for share of repertoire

% expect to take holiday type in 'stable future'

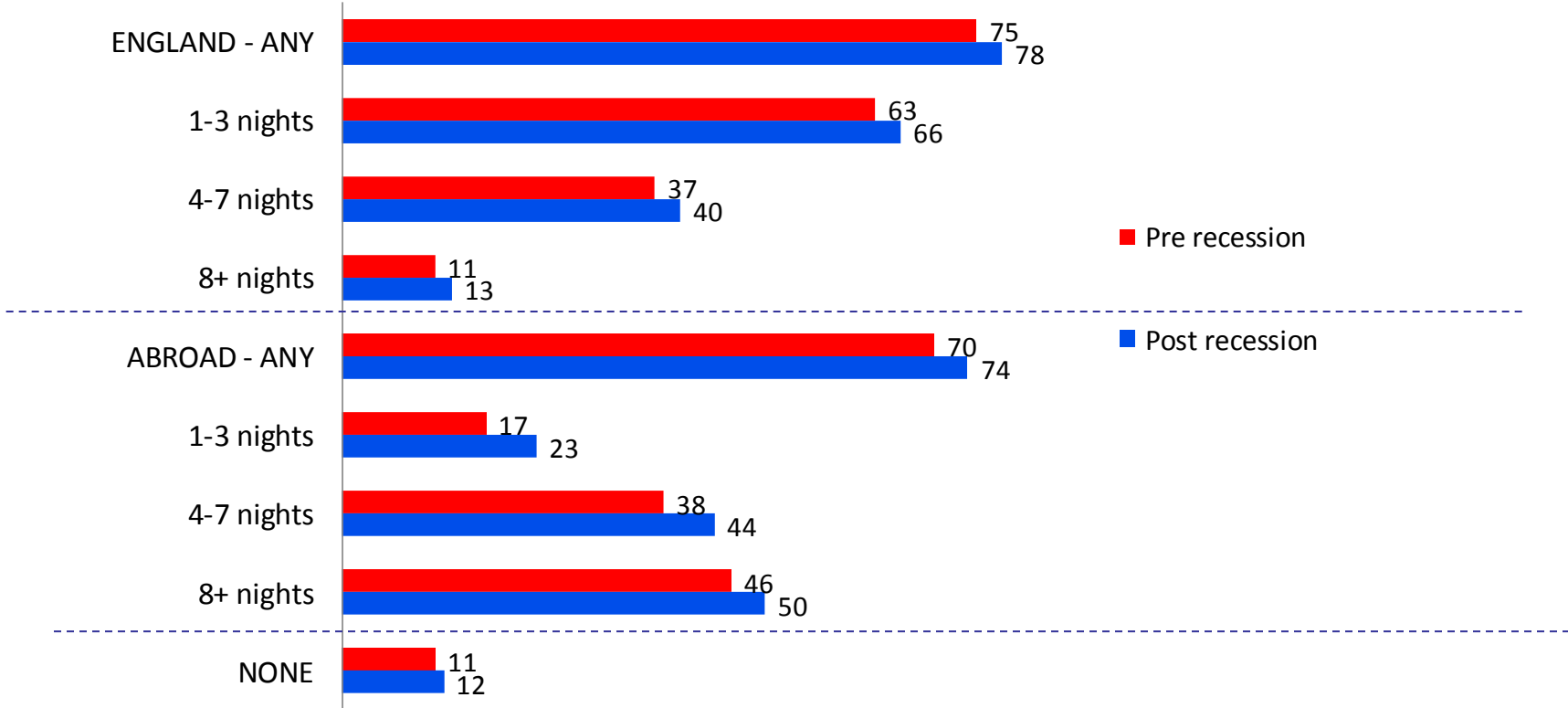
Change from % taken in 2011

% took holiday type Pre-recession/ expect to take Post-recession

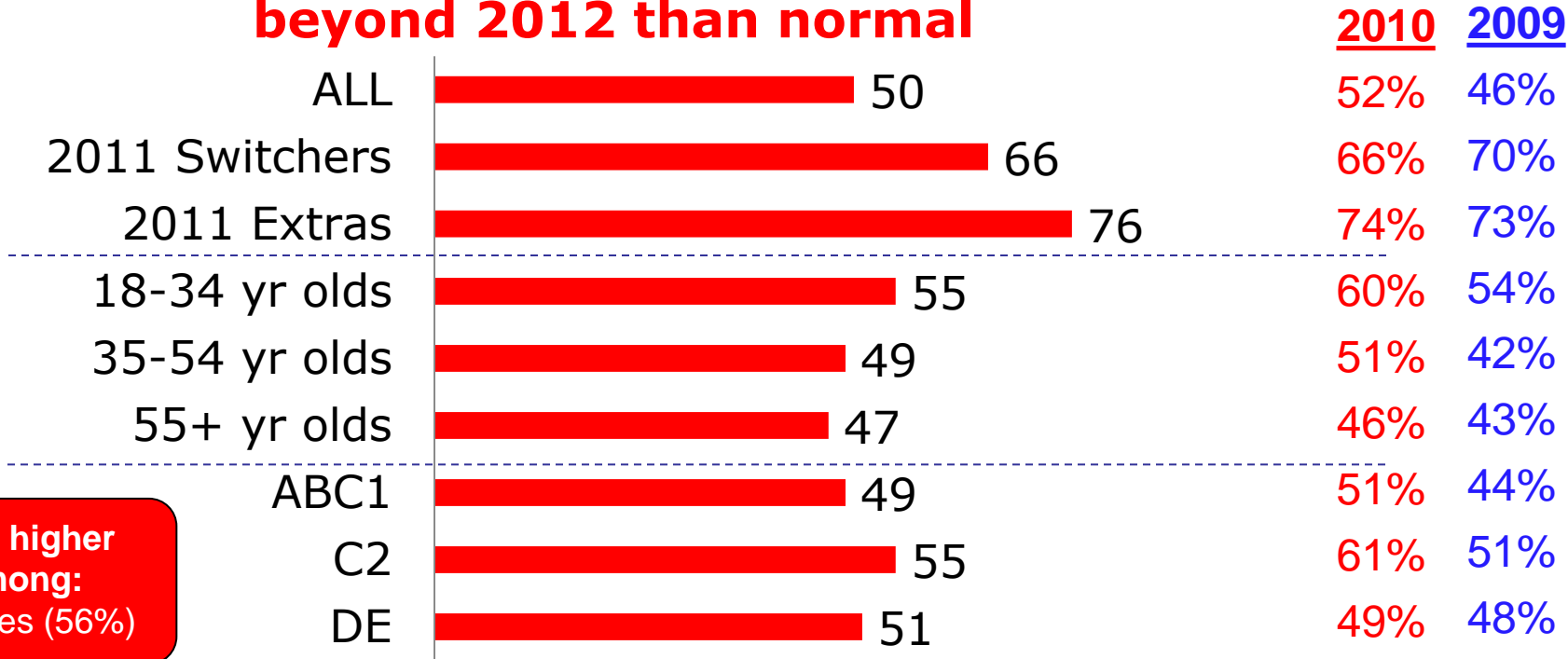

Expectation that more domestic breaks will be taken in future has increased since 2009

- Though this may reflect fears of longer term financial constraints

Q14a In future, beyond 2012, do you think you'll continue replacing holidays you normally took abroad with holidays in the UK?

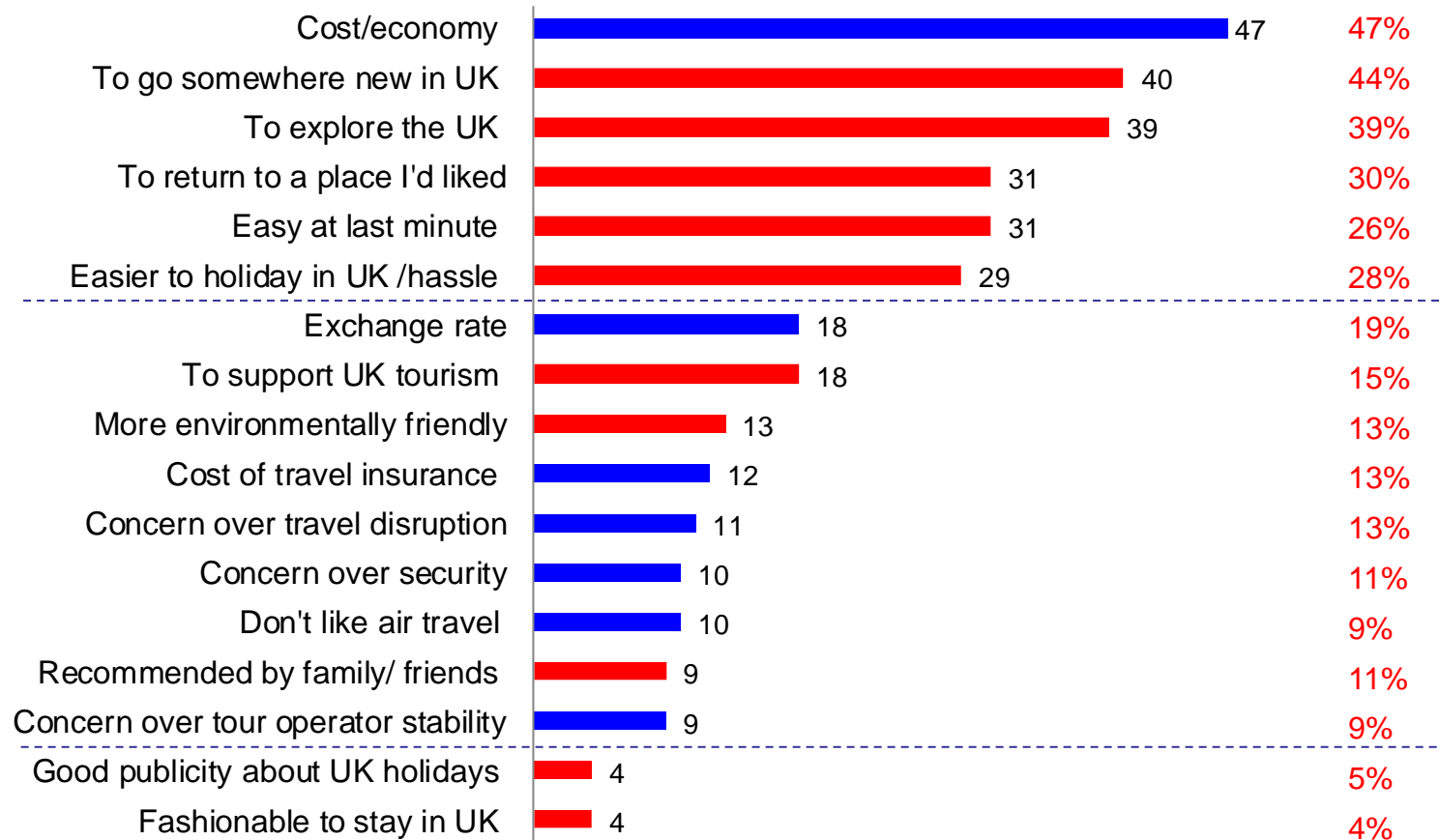
OR In future, beyond 2012, do you think you'll continue to take more holidays in the UK than you used to?

CONCLUSIONS

Conclusions

- ❑ Pessimism about the economy, and about consumers' personal financial situation remains high, and the situation is not thought likely to recover soon
 - As in early 2011, few now unconcerned about the personal impact of the economy
- ❑ The Staycation continued in 2011, with 2 in 10 taking a break in England that would otherwise have been abroad
 - Fewer took holidays abroad in 2011 vs 2010
 - particularly longer breaks, with a small increase in mid length England breaks
- ❑ Financial constraints are the MAIN prompt for 'switching', but positive aspects of an England break provide strong supporting reasons, particularly the wish to explore new places with relatively less hassle
 - continued signs that "Extras" are being affected by financial pressures

Conclusions

- ❑ 2012 holidays are expected to be similar to 2011
 - The London Olympics are likely to impact holiday plans for very few
 - half of those attending the Games/events will adjust their holiday plans, mainly benefitting London during the Games, with a corresponding reduction in trips abroad
 - A very small minority of those *not* attending the Games (3%) will flee the country to escape the hype!
 - Some optimism about increased trip taking abroad looks unlikely to be realised, based on previous expectations vs actual behaviour
- ❑ Once through the recession, people hope to reinstate trips abroad to a level similar to that recalled pre-recession
 - Though this is unlikely to be at the expense of the England holiday
 - 18-34 year olds and families in particular are likely to continue taking more holidays in England, in 2012 & beyond
 - Their positive reasons for doing so (exploring new places, in an easy, hassle free way) should be tapped into with communication, to help convert their intent to action
